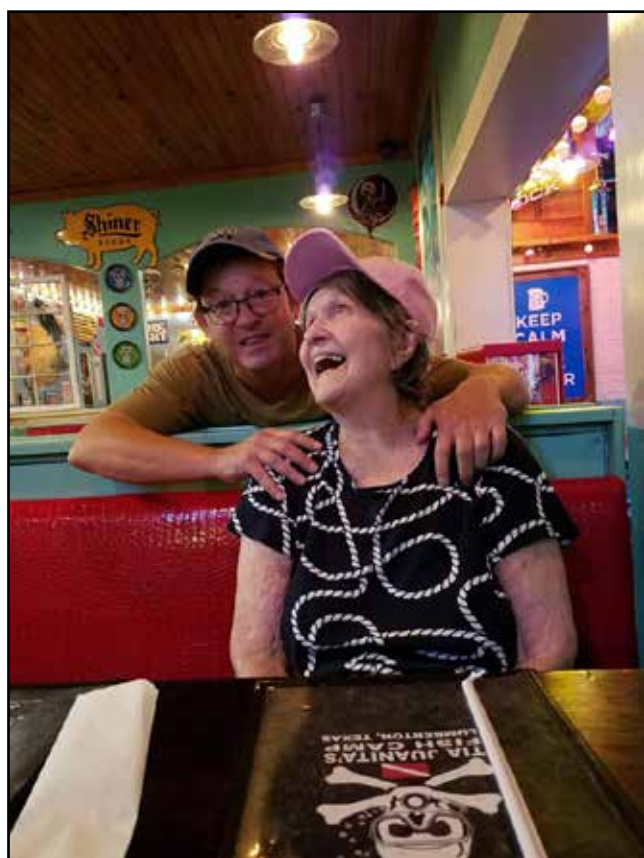

Graduating from high school at 16, she attended University of Hawaii, UCLA, and graduated from Baylor School of Anesthesia as a Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetist and practiced in California, Texas, Arkansas, and Missouri for over thirty years. Having majored in Psychology and minored in Micro-Brain Surgery she had a psychology TV talk show in Dallas at KTVT Channel 11. A highly accomplished athlete, she won the San Francisco Co. Junior Tennis Tournament at age 14. She played semi-pro basketball under Babe Didrikson, had multiple runner-up finishes in golf club championships and continued playing until a major debilitating stroke two years ago at 94. Lisa also excelled as a snow skier and loved Big Thicket hunting. She authored a children's book, "Dottie, The Polka dotted Butterfly." A devout LDS member. Lisa was honored to be Sour Lake's Old-Timer of the Year. She was the most

marvelous mother, grandmother, aunt, and friend who was always the life of every party and while she was around, there was never a dull moment!
