nephews, from Beaumont to Louisiana.

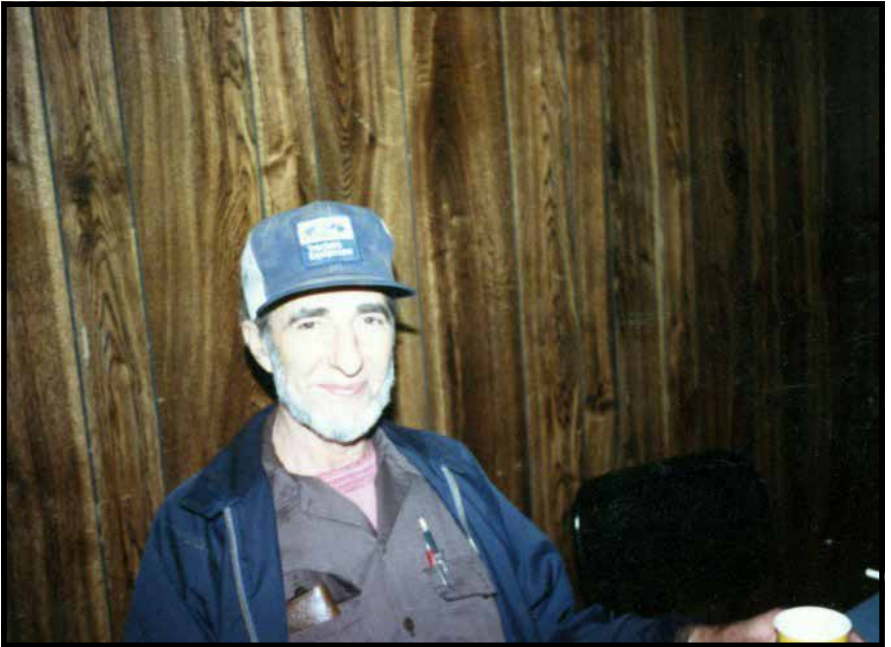
