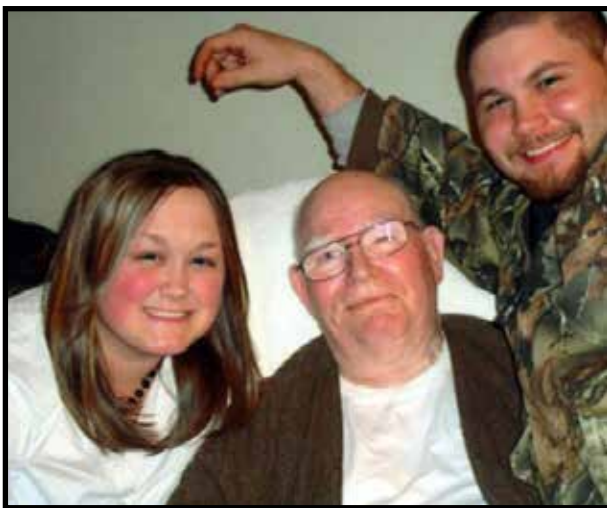
He is preceded in death by parents; sons, Wayne Bardwell and Keith Christen; and sister, Yvonne Matlock.





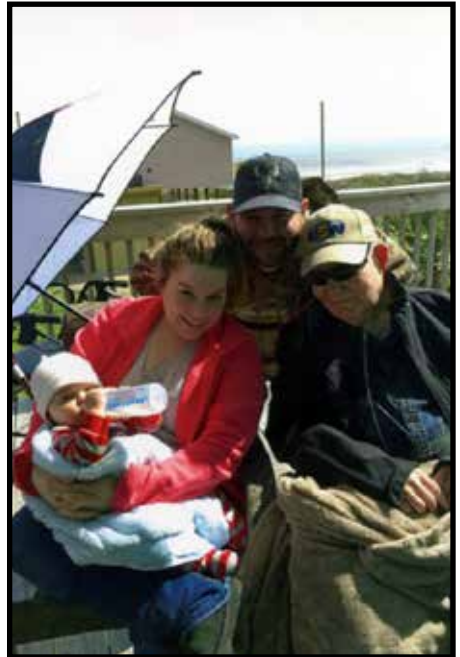
