





Surrounded by the love of his beloved family, James Elliott Barlow, known to his family as Buzz, was called to the Lord on September 12, 2017, in College Station at the age of 66, after a lengthy illness. Born in Beaumont on June 14, 1951, Buzz had a loving family of two parents, two siblings, five nieces and nephews, many loving aunts and uncles, and numerous cousins. He graduated from South Park High School in 1969, and attended Lamar University. He volunteered into the U.S. Navy and received a high security


