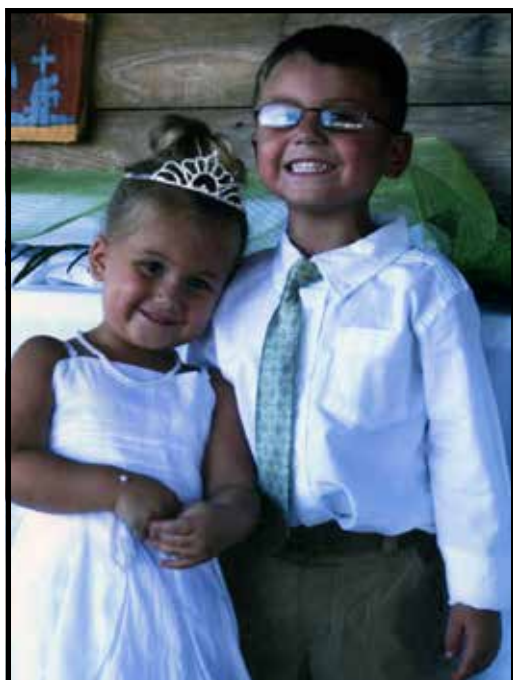
Pauline “Miss Polly” Corona Bertino lived a loving and giving life of 95 years and died at her residence on October 2, 2017.

Tell Pop not to worry about the liquor store. We will be in Wednesday.

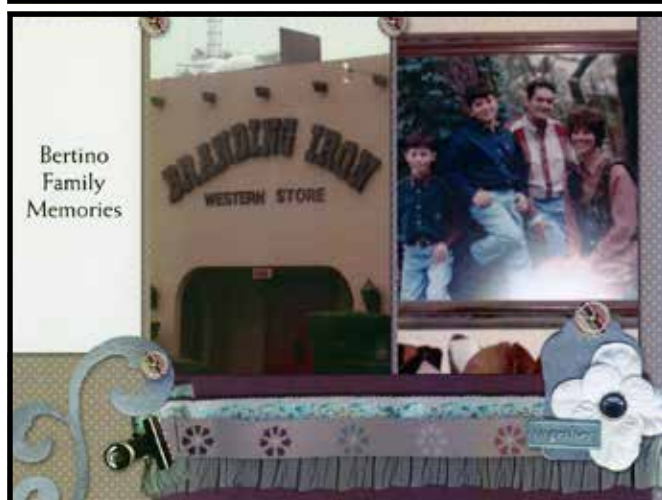
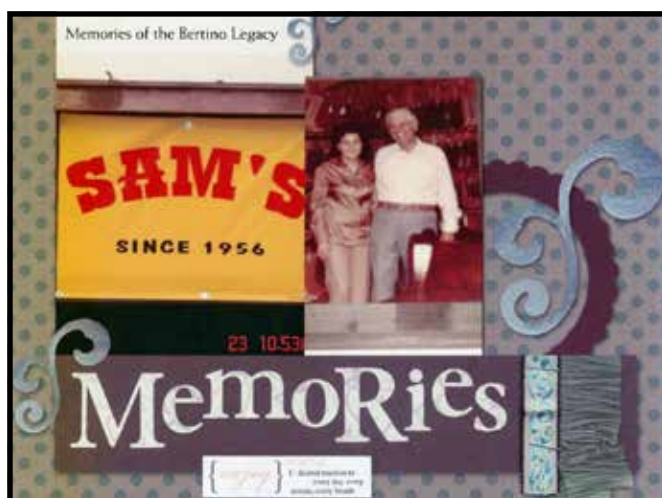

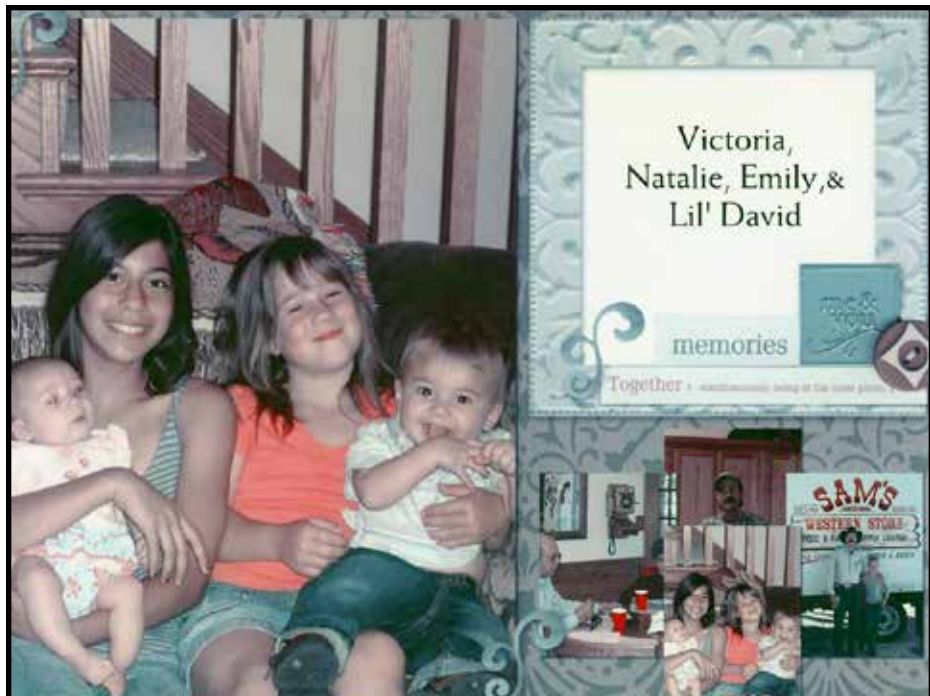
I have been wondering how you and Mary Jo are feeling. Hope you're had a lot of rest and feeling fine.

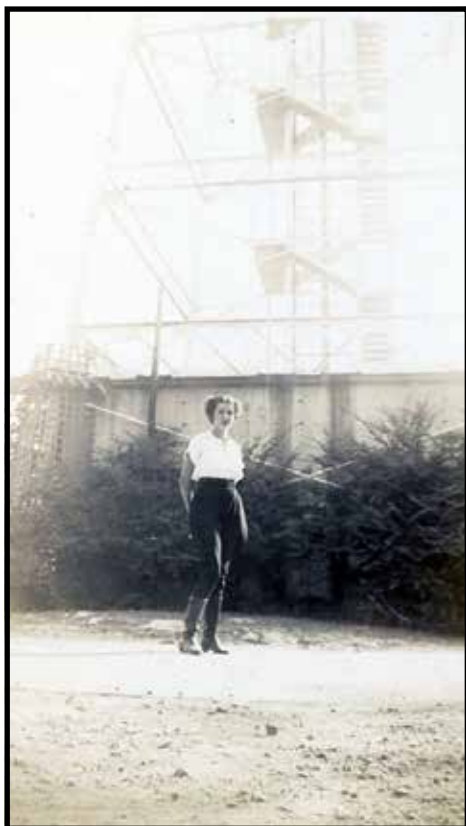
