While not having children of his own, he was a second dad, grandfather, and great-grandfather to a host of nieces and nephews who he loved as his own.





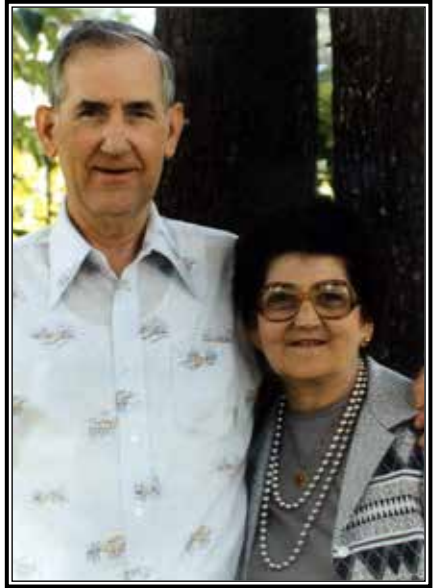
