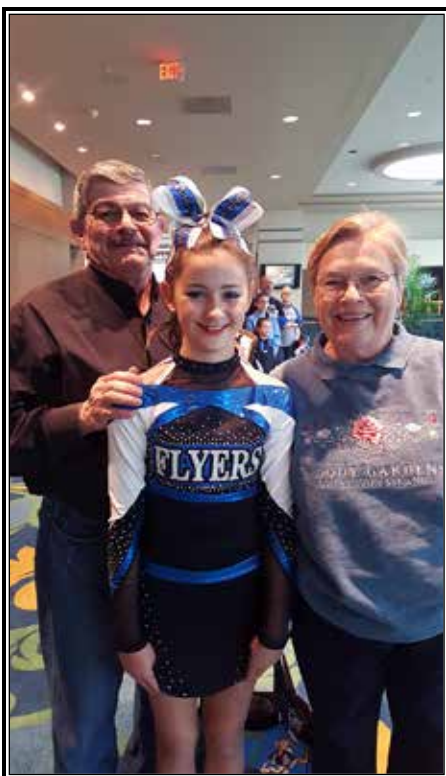
He is preceded in death by his parents and brother, Victor.



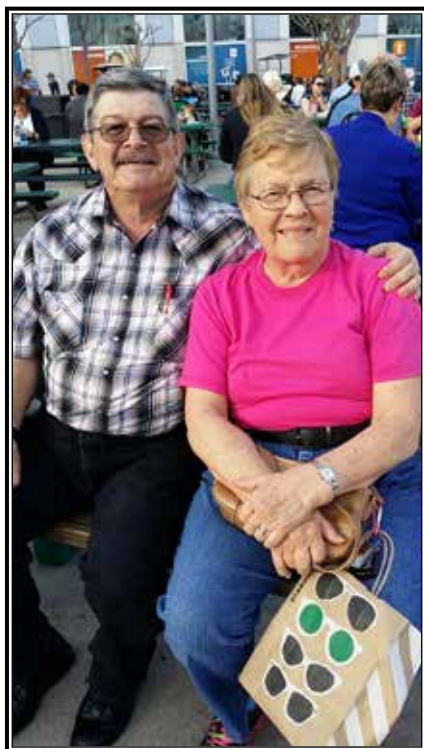
