Martin Francis Carey, Jr., 78, of Nederland, died Friday, November 22, 2019. He was born on February 20, 1941, in Port Arthur, to Bernice Marie Dekerlegand Carey and Martin Francis Carey, Sr.

Martin grew up in Groves Texas. He attended Immaculate Conception Catholic School and graduated from Bishop Byrne High School in 1959. He went on to serve in the United States Air Force for three years and then joined the Army National Guard, retiring after twenty years, while simultaneously

working at Eastman Kodak for twenty-five years. Serving in the military and working full-time at Eastman Kodak kept Martin busy, but he still found time to coach his three sons and several grandsons in Junior League Football. His volunteer coaching tenure continued for thirty plus years. Many of those years were spent coaching even though none of his children or grandchildren were playing.

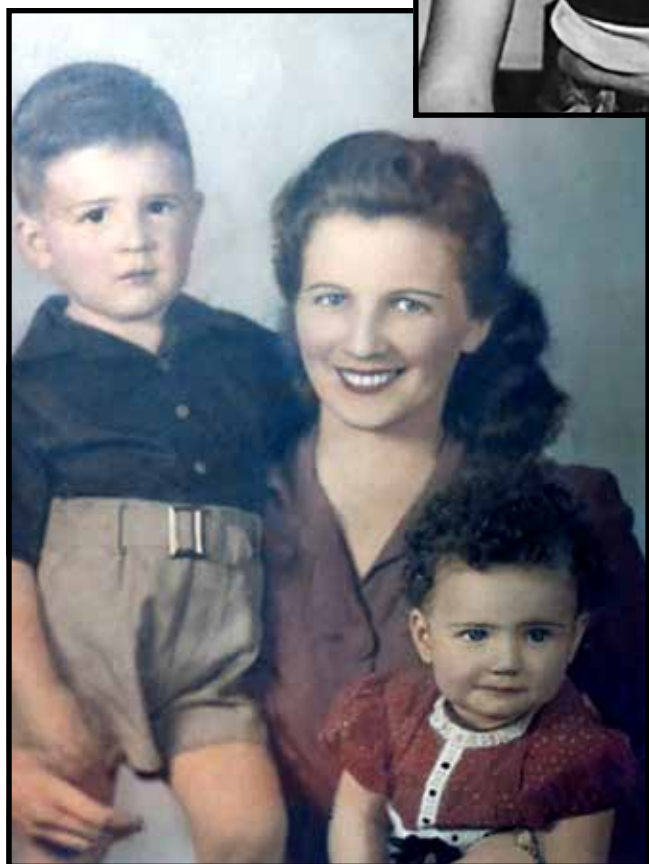
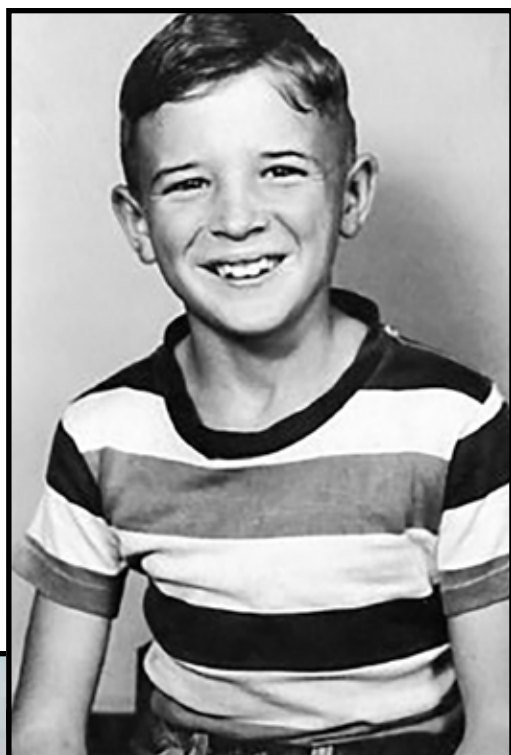

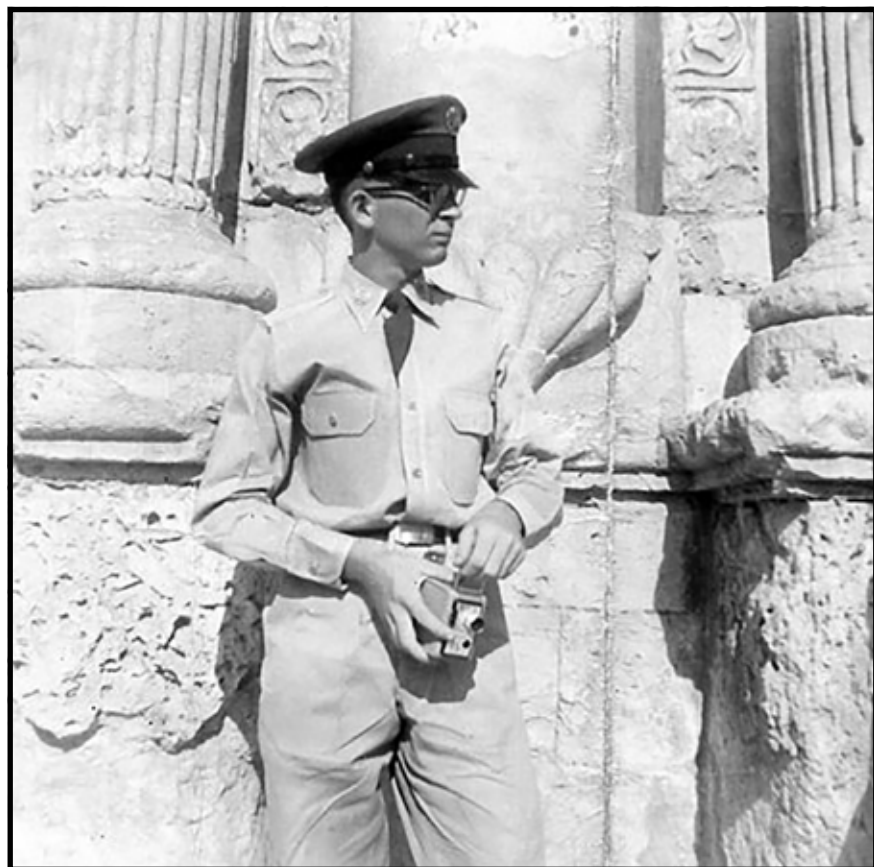
