



MOTHER'S CORNBREAD DRESSING

When my Grandmother died many years ago, my Mother had to take over this family favorite at holidays, which was the cornbread dressing. I have been watching her over the years and the last few years, I have had to take over this task. She did give her approval. Please know that she never measured anything, so I will just put in words the way that I make it.

Bake enough cornbread that will feed your size family. Crumble in bowl & cover with chicken broth or stock until soupy. Celery, green onions, bell pepper (my Mother did not saute) but I do in butter just so they are not too crunchy sometime. Pour in cornbread mixture. Add poultry seasoning, salt & pepper (Mama always said it needed lots of pepper). Mother did not care for sage. Boil eggs & chop up and add to cornbread mixture. It may seem too runny, but when you bake, it will absorb the liquid & will not turn out too dry. Pour in baking pan & bake 300-350 (depending on your oven) until brown on top (I don't have a time, just check on it periodically & stick knife in to see if done). Be sure & sample before you start baking to make sure enough seasoning, especially black pepper. If you are not cooking a turkey on the side, we sometime would boil a hen & de-bone & add meat to the dressing to bake & use the stock with your cornbread.)

I know this is not your usual idea of a recipe, but I wanted to share one of our Family favorites with you to honor and remember our Mother. She was a great cook. We hope you enjoy as much as we do.
