The family wishes to thank all of those who cared for her during her last days.



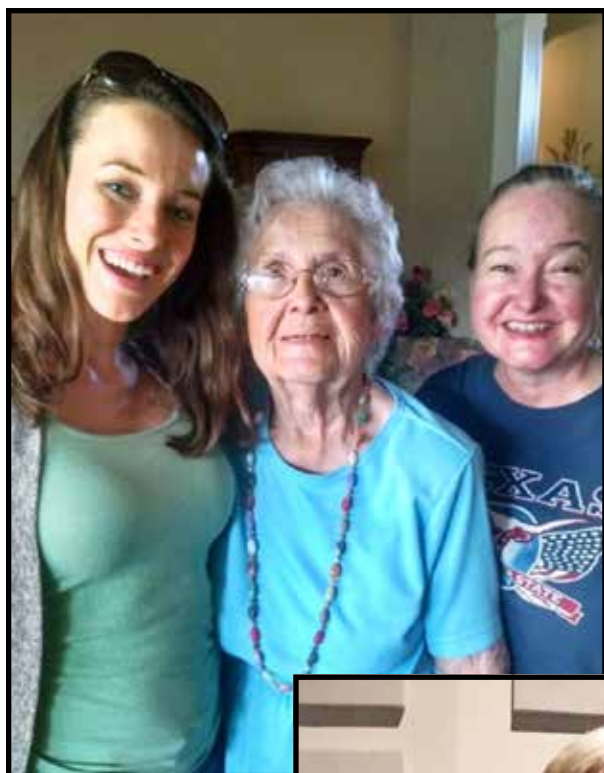












“The Love of God”
