He is preceded in death by his son, Joey Daigle; brothers, Horace and Linus; and sisters, Frances, Urella, May, and Bell.

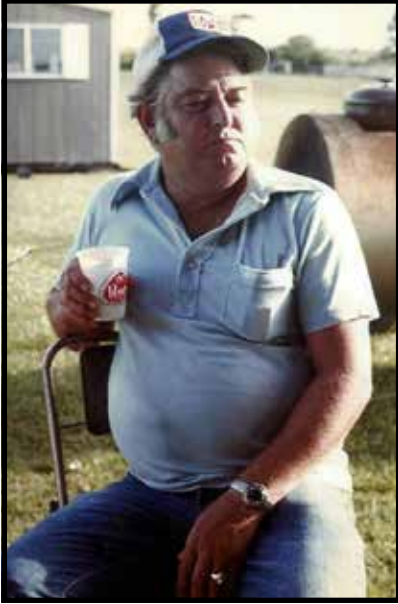
