May her memory be a blessing.

























Buffalo Chip Cookies

2 cups cornflakes


2 cups pecans


1 lrg pkg chocolate

- Refrigerate overnight. Drop by ice cream scoops on lightly greased cookie sheet. Bake at 350 F for 10-12 minutes







