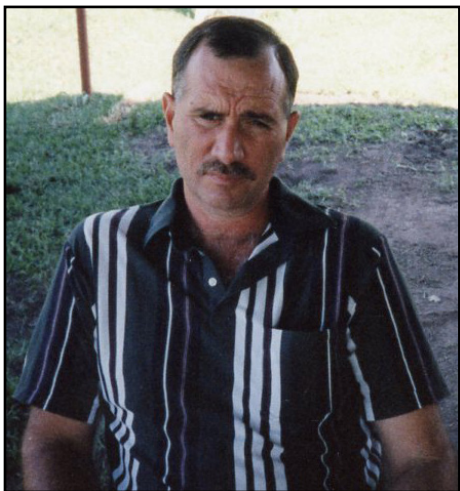

The Lord blessed Constance Marie and Adolph Duhon, on January 24, 1953, as Gary was born in Brooklyn, New York.

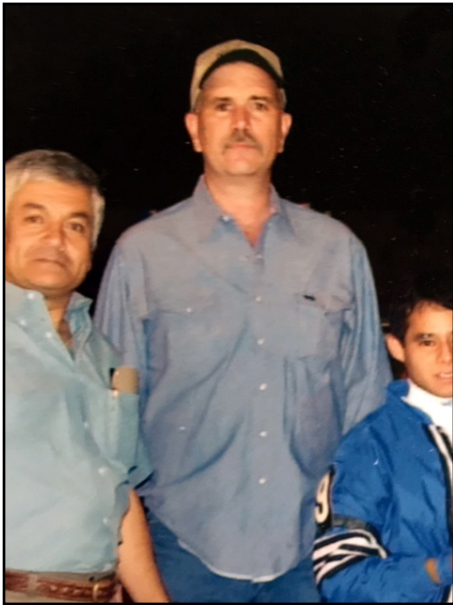
After relocating to Winnie, Texas, he graduated from Hamshire-Fannett High School. Gary, his

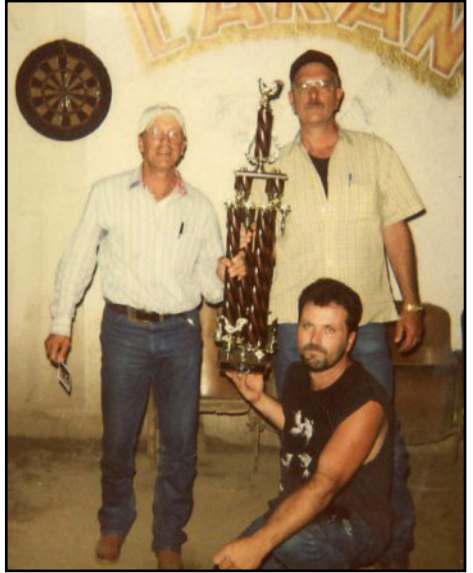

Mr. Duhon is preceded in death by his parents.





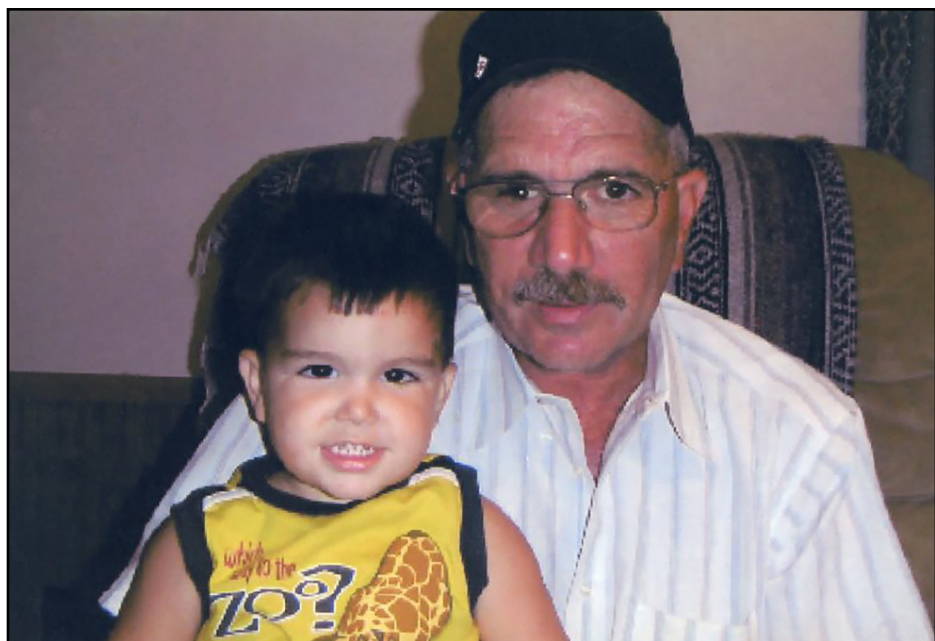
