children, and animals. He could make us laugh on our worst days. Your work here is done. Rest in peace, little brother. You will live on in our hearts forever.

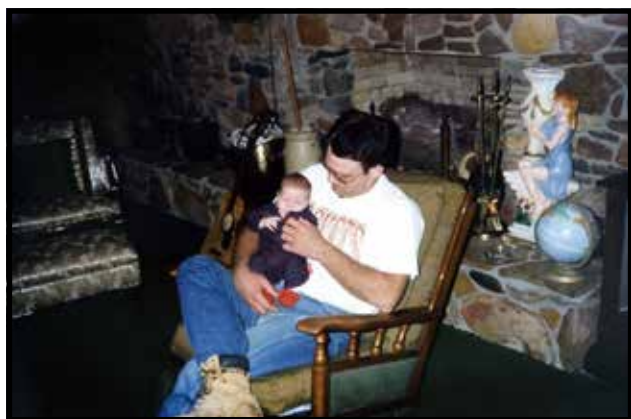
