She loved to be informed and was ready and able to debate any issue if you so dared. She was bright, colorful, independent, funny, sassy, feisty, and accepting of everyone. Her laughter was contagious. Her forgiving heart and love for others was endless.

She loved her family, especially her grandchildren, they were her world!! She was their care giver, playmate and most importantly their WoWo. She would say "NaNa NuNu, MawMaw's little DoDo" as they tickled and giggled over the years. She allowed them all they wanted in excess, baby bottles or sippy cups even if they were older in age, treats of any kind, McDonald's, playing dress up, and driving lessons well before the legal age to do so. Nothing was off limits. She did not provide material things, she showered them with love.
