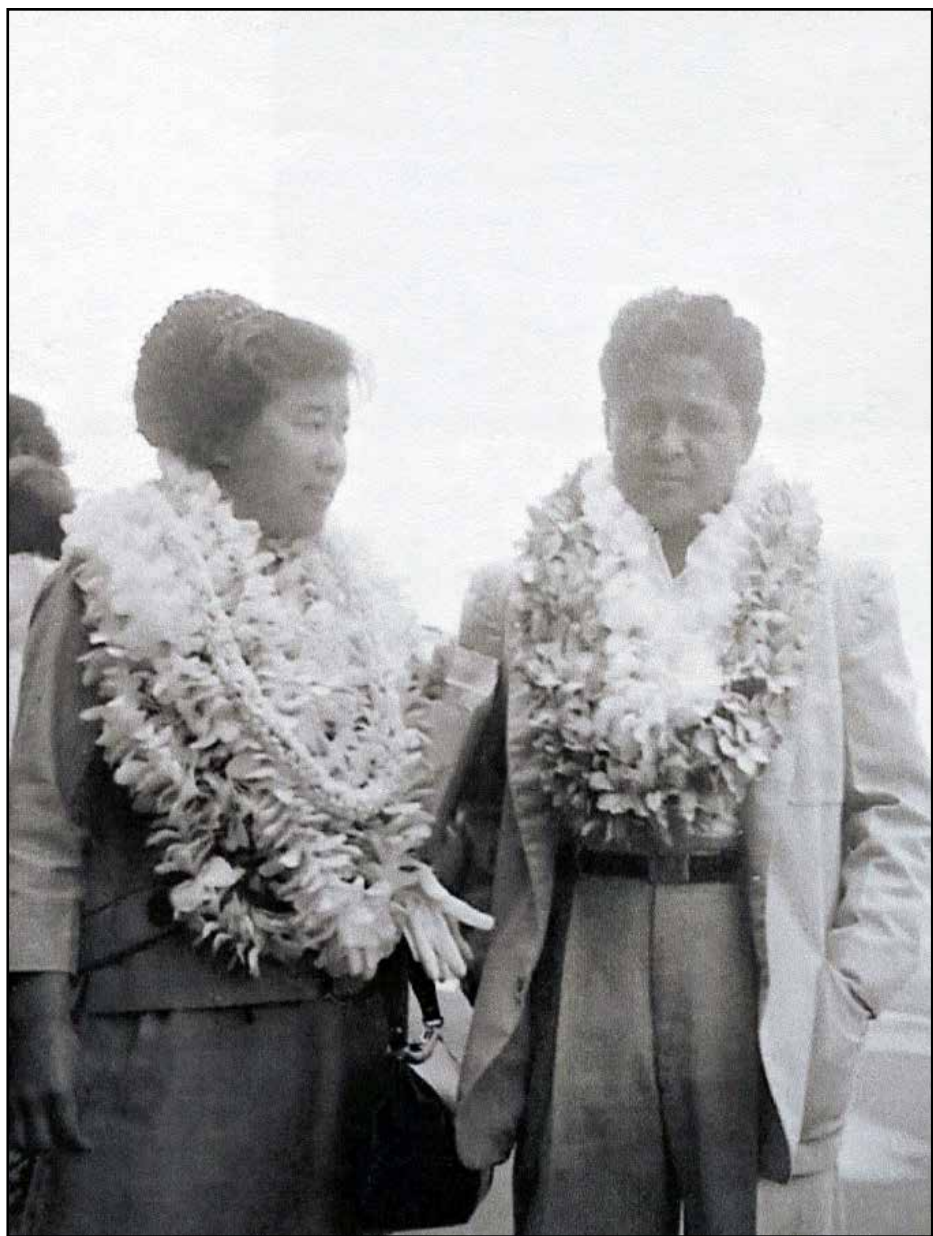

Mayhaw Jelly

3 lb. Mayhaw Berries.

Crush Berries one layer at a time. Add 4 cups Water.
COVER & SIMMER 10 min, stirring occasionally.
Extract juice (put in Bag or several thickness of
cheese cloth.) Let drip or can hasten by
squeezing bag.

To make Jelly:

4 cups prepared mayhaw juice
5 1/2 cups (2 lb. 6 oz) sugar
1 box Sure-Jell pectin

- ① Stir sure-jell pectin ~~and~~ into juice.
- ②. Bring to full boil (can't be stirred
over) down)
