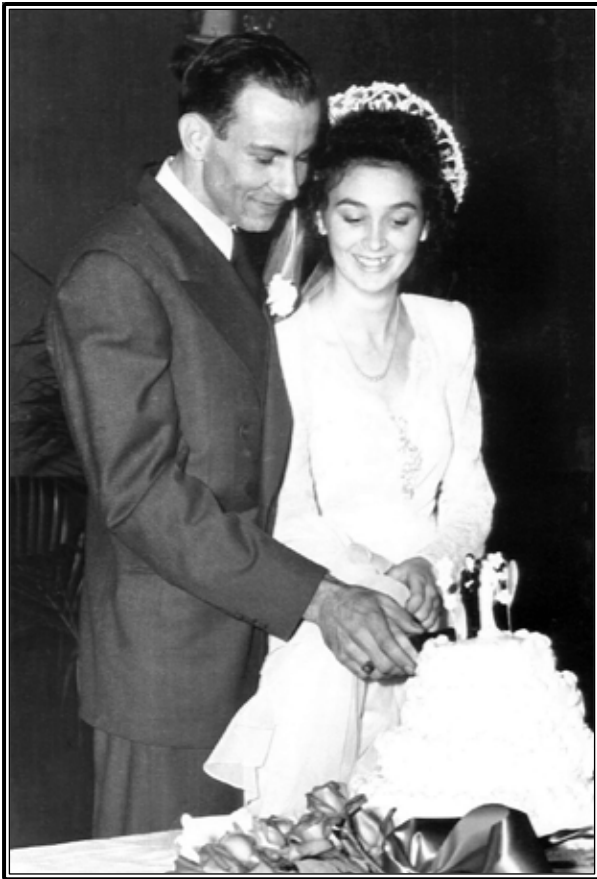

Russell John Folsie, Sr., 93 of Beaumont, entered into eternal rest with the Lord, Wednesday, August 30, 2017. He was born on January 8, 1924, to Lucille Chauvin Folsie and Theodore Folsie in Beaumont, and was a United States Army veteran having served in World War II. He met Theresa, the love of his life, upon returning home from the war and they were married November 23, 1946. Their 70-year legacy of love and commitment is the cornerstone of the family and continues to serve as an example to their children and grandchildren.

Russell, also known as Grandpa, Gramps, and PawPaw was dearly loved and a man of strong character. He enjoyed spending time with his family, and all of his grandchildren brought him great joy.
