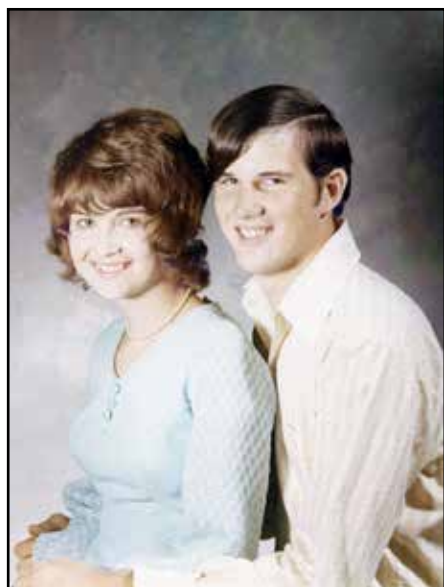
She is preceded in death by her parents; and several aunts and uncles.
