Peggy Mignon Greenspan, 93, of Beaumont, passed away peacefully on August 7, 2018. From the moment she was born to Hamilton and Mignon Faulk in Austin on January 9, 1925, Peggy was a gifted legacy.

An avid tap dancer, she learned with future Tony Award winner Tommy Tune in her Aunt Camille's studio, then became a dance teacher herself. She was a "doer," serving as District PTA President,

Sisterhood President and as a founding member of the Beaumont Civic Ballet. Her real passion was mental health. She served many terms as President of the Mental Health Association of Jefferson County, and also on the state board. A very proud moment for her was when she received the Julie Rogers Special Service Award for her work in the mental health field.

But her real legacy began at UT, when she met Arthur Greenspan, a WWII veteran studying Accounting, and married him soon thereafter. Theirs was a 59-year romance, and during their time together Peggy supported and encouraged Arthur's CPA activities, leading to his TSCPA Presidency. They traveled extensively during this period of time, which pleased Peggy tremendously. She loved to "GO!"

Peggy's legacy continues today, not only through her five children and their descendants, but also through the many friends and strangers to whom she opened her heart along the way.
