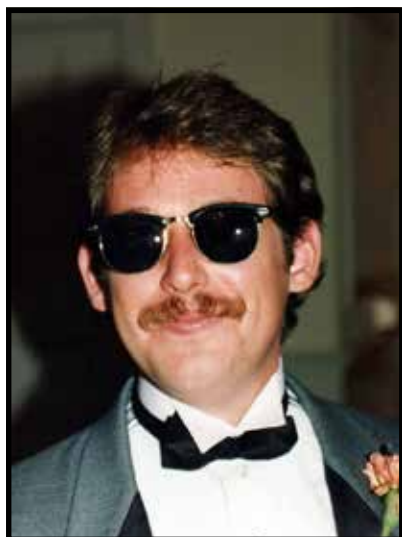
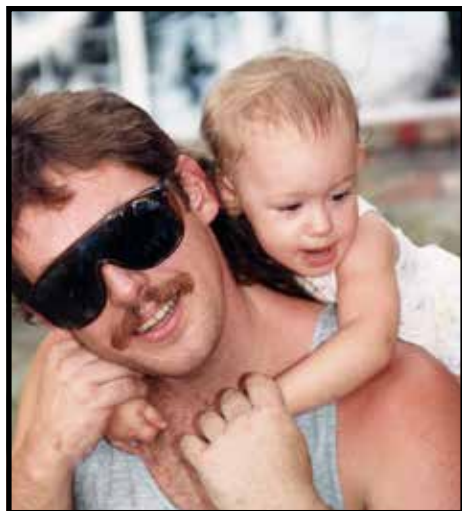
Most importantly, Todd was a passionate follower of Jesus. He was a member of Redemption Church where he loved to serve and pray for everyone he met.

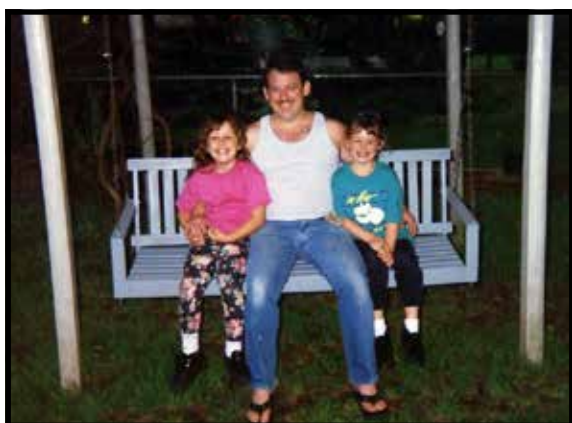
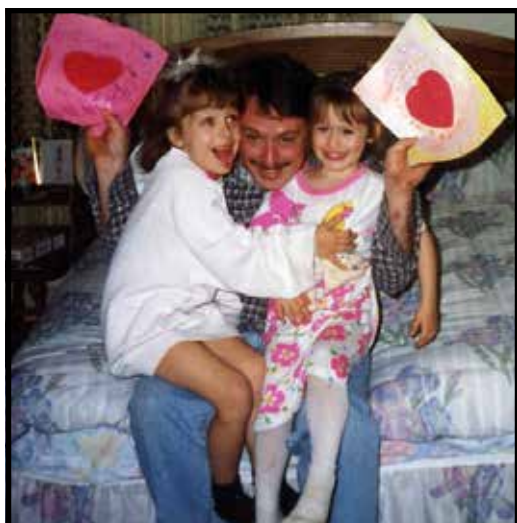

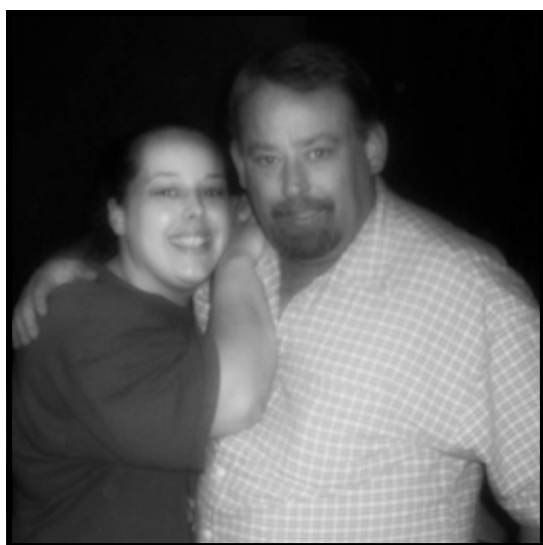














Our Daddy - Our Pal
