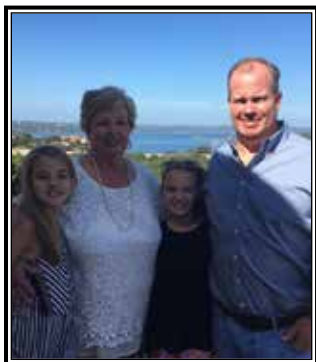

A graduate of Kelly High School, he attended Texas Tech University where he was a member of Sigma Alpha Epsilon fraternity. In 2001, after 9/11, he enlisted in the United States Marine Corps and served in Japan and Iraq. Returning home

after his honorable discharge, he finished his degree at Lamar University and then pursued a career as an independent petroleum landman.
