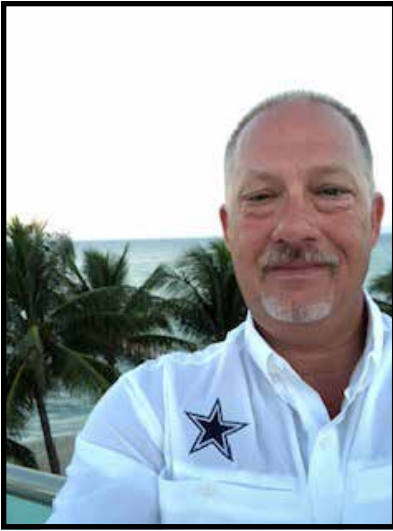

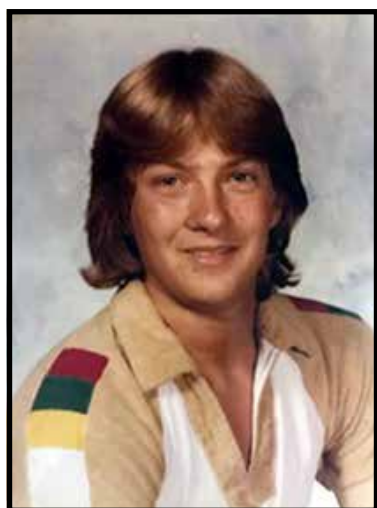
& could do for them as well. He would often say, “I just want everyone else to have what I have: “A personal relationship with Christ.”
