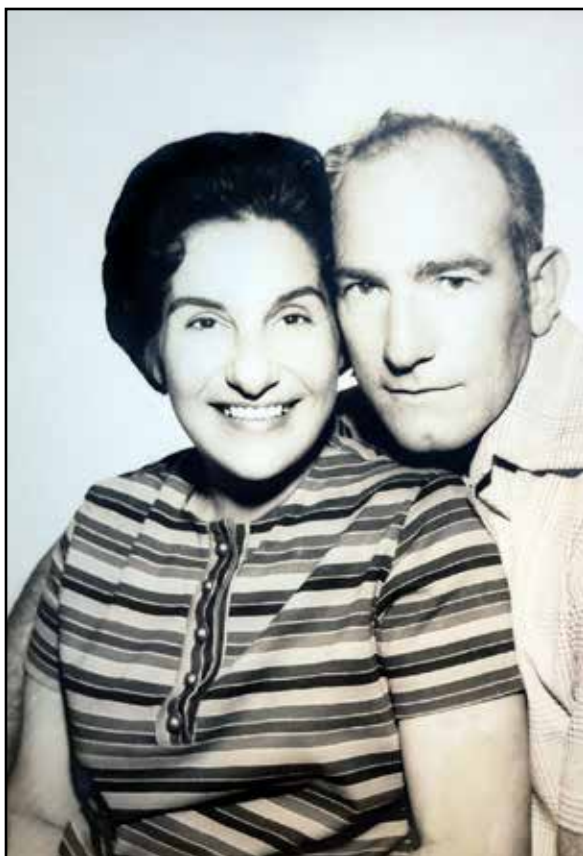
Leonard was a United States Army veteran that enjoyed fishing, gardening, and watching football. He retired from being an operator at Texaco after thirty-eight years.

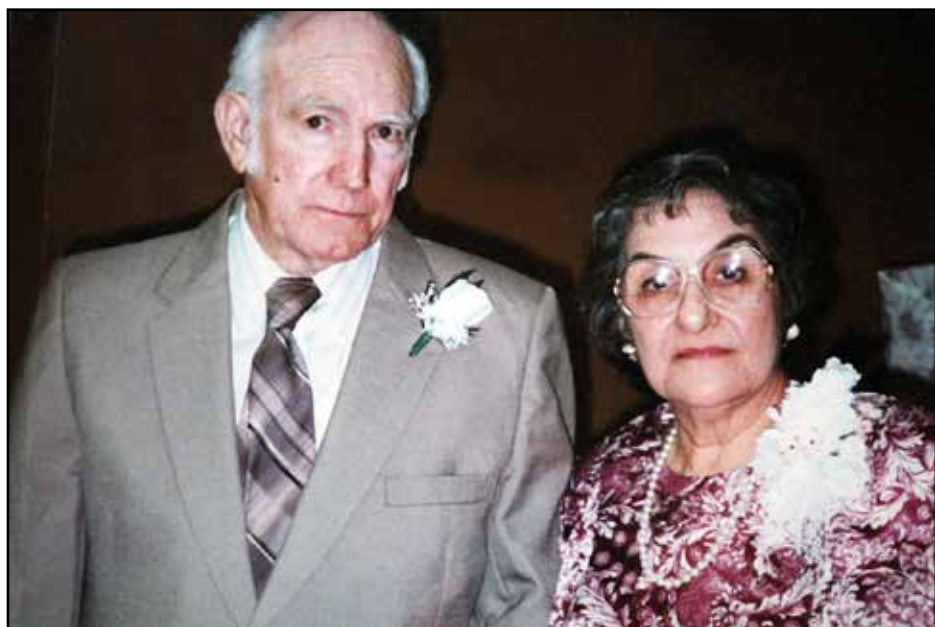
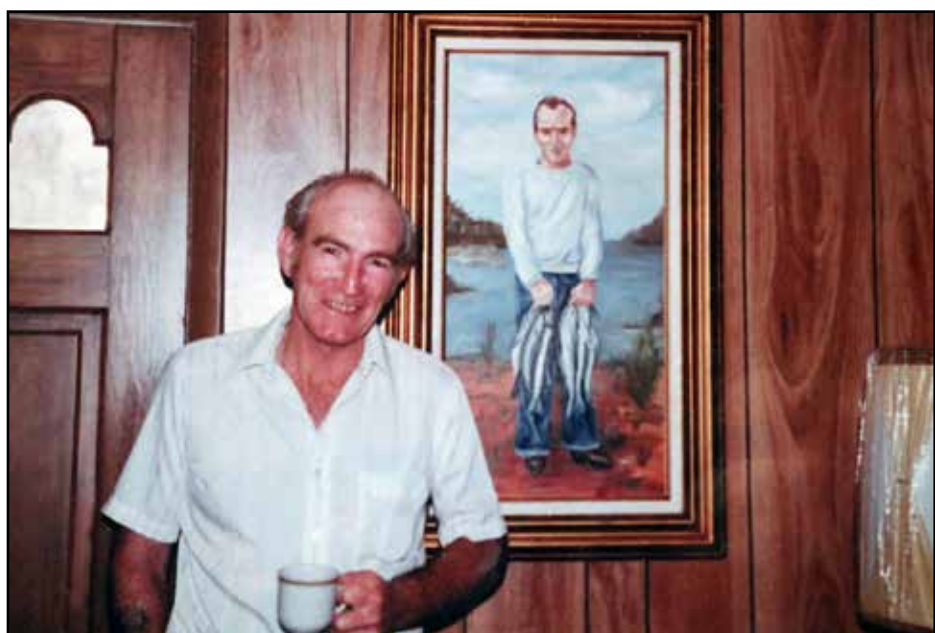
