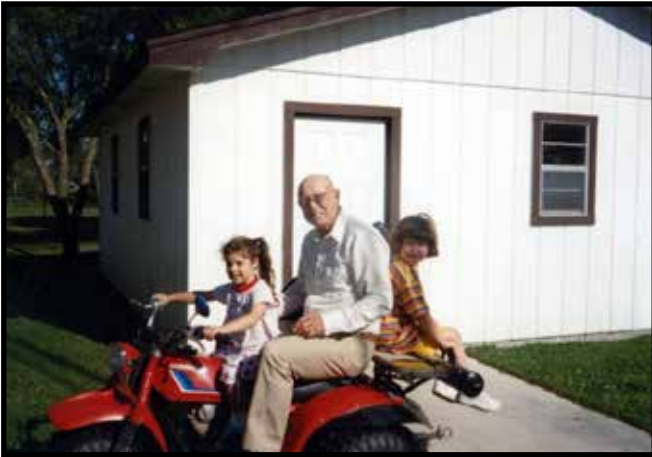

He is preceded in death by his sisters, Rebecca Fontenot and Laskie Rougeau and granddaughter, Caitlin Sanders Hickman.



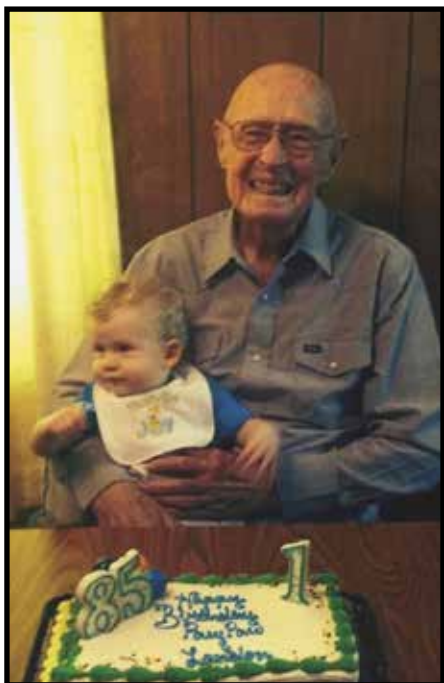
