She is preceded in death by her daughter, Vandra McBride.



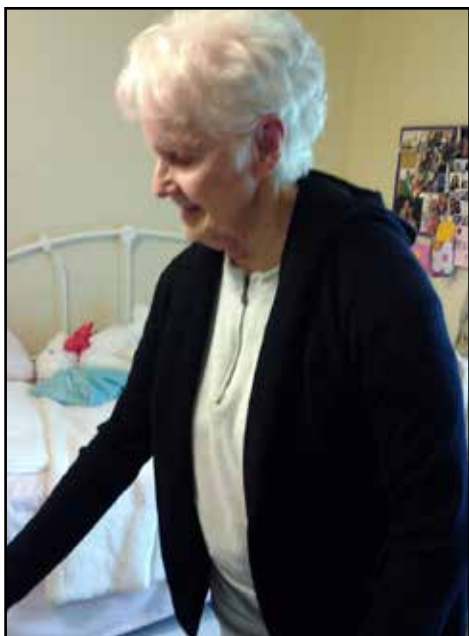
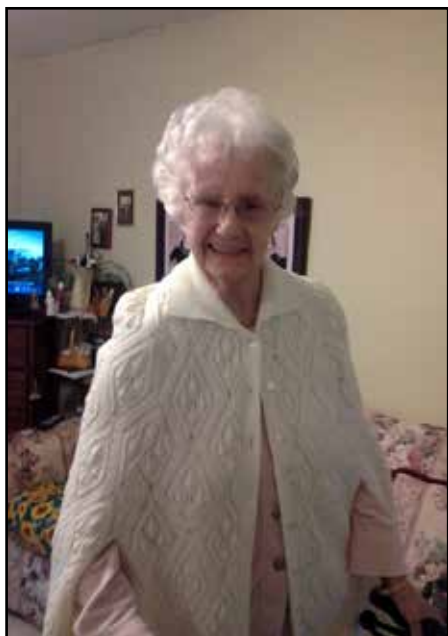
