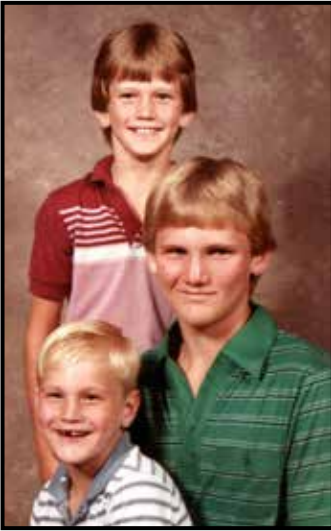
























A Temporary Separation
