always included his extended family, and welcomed them all.

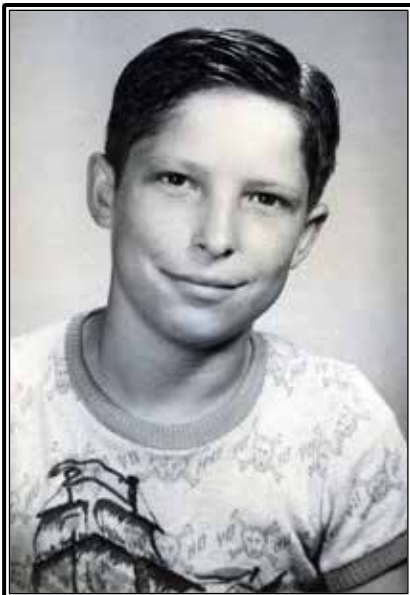

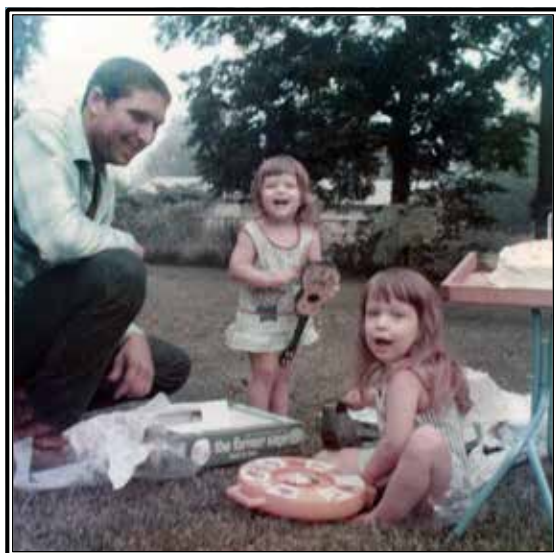
