He was often the first man people thought of if they had a question about anything from cars to heavy machinery and usually even had the part you needed laying around somewhere.

His most favorite role by far, however, was being “PaPa”. His grandchildren, Michaela, Denson, and Averie were his world.

Though already a believer, Dalton found a stronger personal relationship with Jesus Christ and was baptized on Christmas Day, 2017. On November 19, 2018, Dalton was diagnosed with Acute Myeloid Leukemia. He was known by his toughness and this battle proved no different. He continued to fight for four months, but ultimately on March 12, 2019, the Lord called him home to comfort. Dalton and Carolyn were married for thirty-two years and together had two children and three grandchildren.

He was his family’s greatest treasure and will be missed until we meet again. We will, “See you Sometime” and love you very much.
