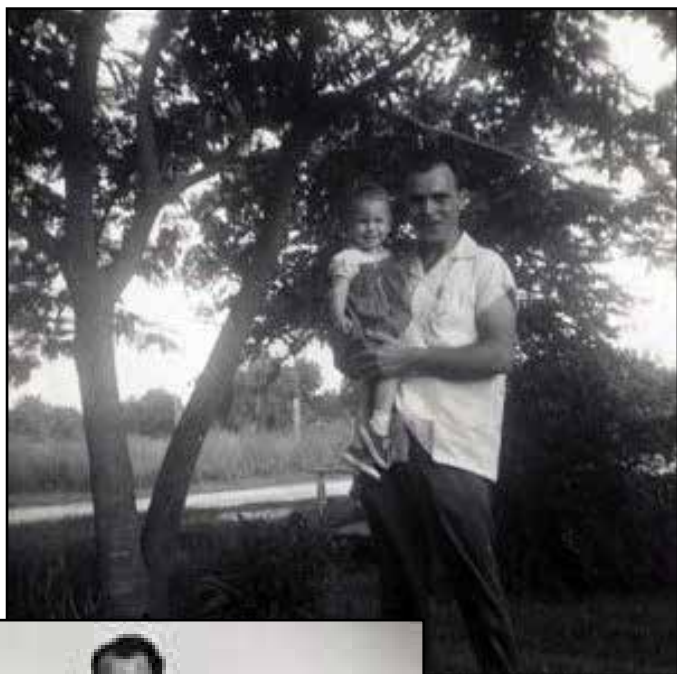

need and was known to many as "Uncle George" or "Brother George". He loved to provide pies and biscuits to many folks.

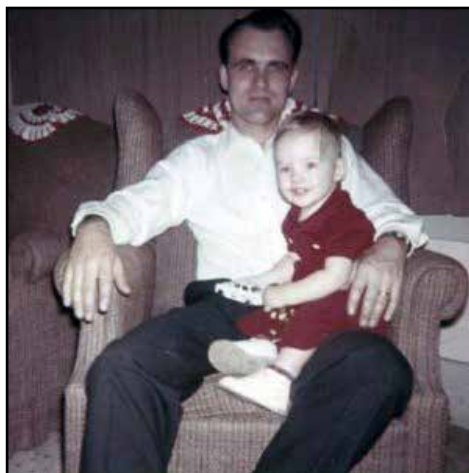
