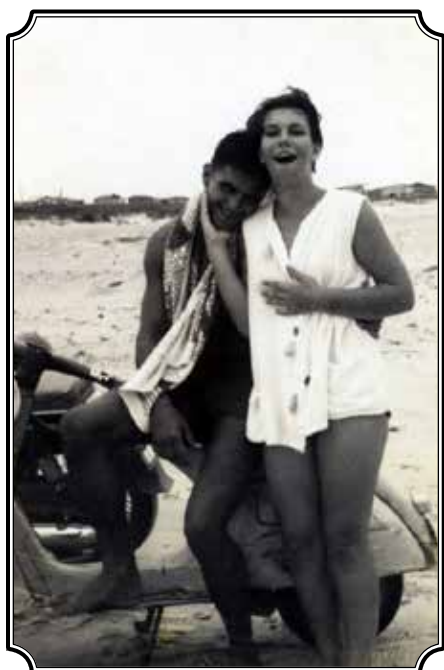

Then turned, and bid farewell to all*

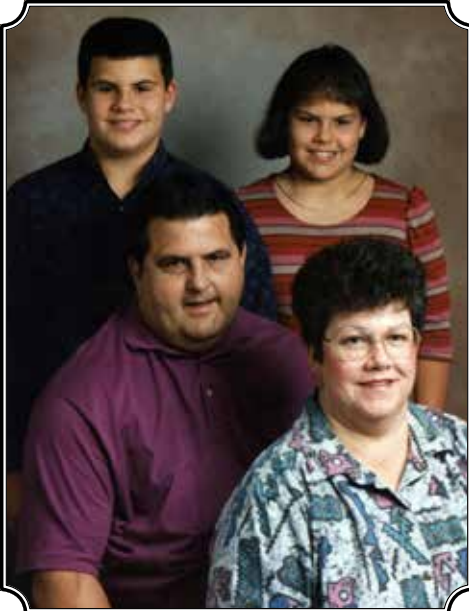
*I could not stay another day
