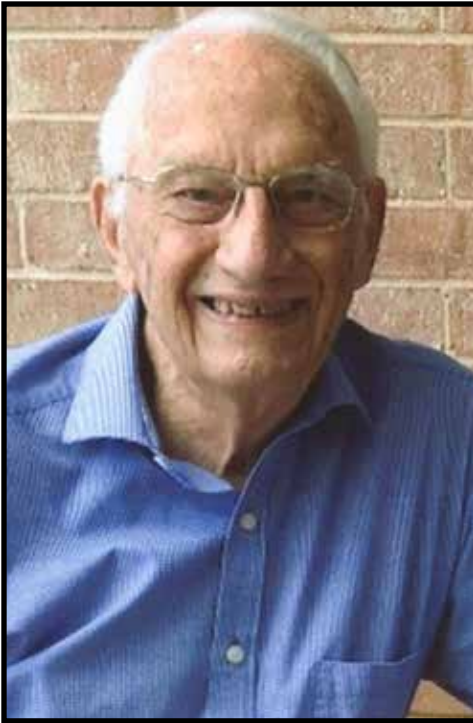

He was born on May 9, 1927, to Marie Leidner Schroder and John Philip Schroder, in New Orleans, Louisiana. He was a graduate of Warren Easton High School in New Orleans. Upon graduation, he joined the United States Army and was stationed in Austria. Upon return, he attended SLI (Southwestern Louisiana Institute) and graduated with an Electrical Engineering degree. While at SLI he met his future wife, Alice Broussard. A lifelong love of crabbing started on their first date! When Johnny graduated from SLI, they moved to Beaumont, Texas,

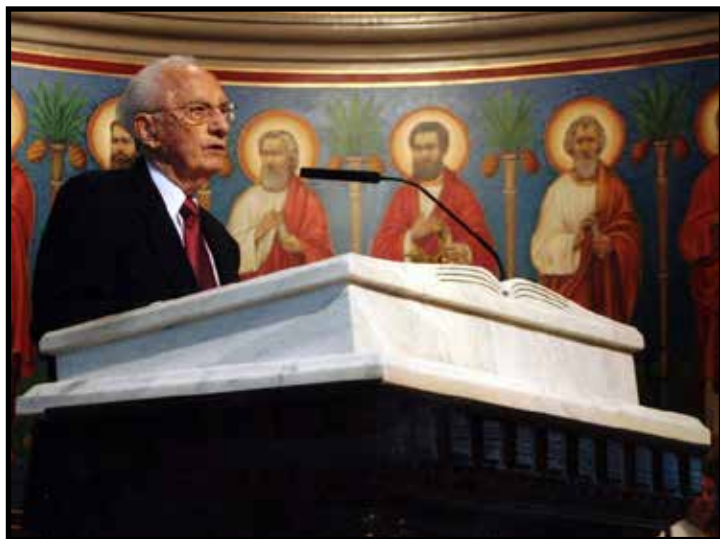
He is preceded in death by his parents; sisters, Rosemay Landry and Jacqueline Davis; and great-grandchild, Saoirse Bishop.

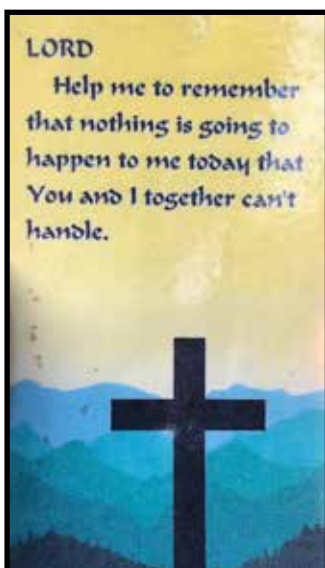
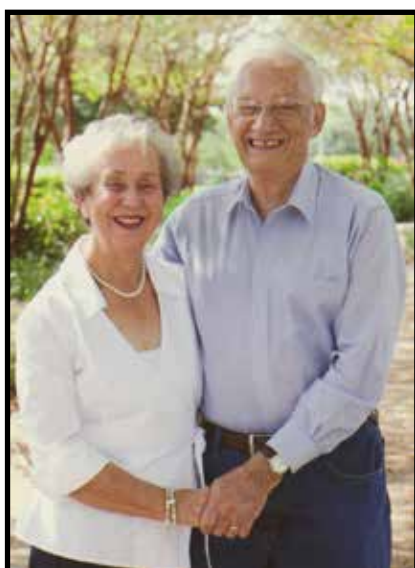




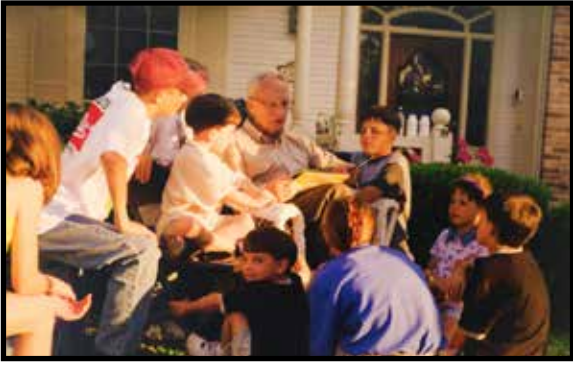
