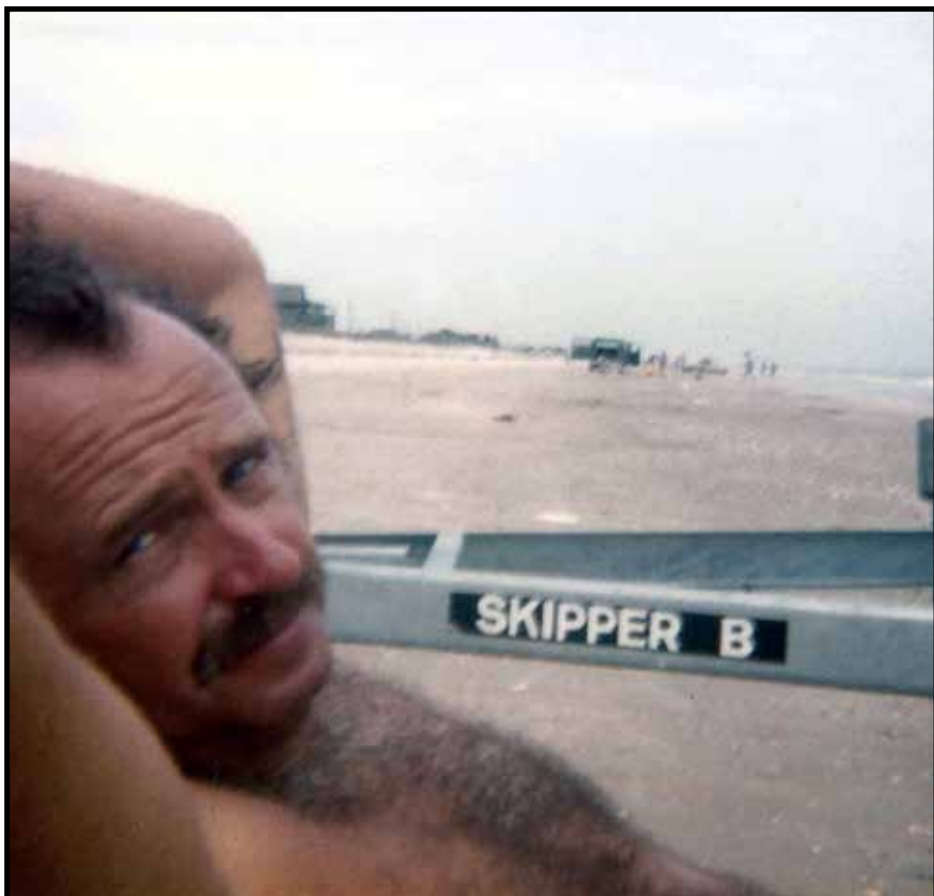

With me that you also may be where I am.

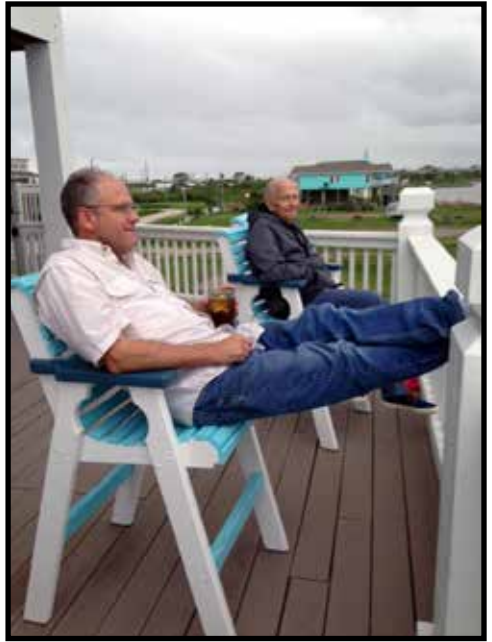
