was born in Port Arthur, Texas, to Joyce Reid Flowers and Kenneth Westmoreland on November 20, 1954. She was raised by her grandparents, Elmer and Edwina Reid. In 1973, she graduated from Sharpstown High School, where she was on the Apollo Queens Dance Team and head cheerleader of the cheer squad. She attended Stephen F. Austin State University, filling her time with cheerleading and studying to become a teacher. It was at SFA where she met the love of her life, Lyn Stevens. On December 18, 1976, Lyn and Vicki were married

in Port Arthur, Texas. From 1978-1980, she supported her new husband while he studied to become a lawyer at Baylor Law School in Waco, Texas. She eventually graduated from Lamar University in 1982 with a BA in Education and minor in Dance.

Vicki loved to dance. She performed in several ballets including: Cinderella, Oklahoma, Rodeo, The Nutcracker, Swan Lake, and many many more. Before having children, Vicki spent her time raising several pets—including her new mastiff puppy, Sheba, and her cat Lulu. She discovered her love for animals at a young age while visiting her grandfather's farm in Leesville, Louisiana. Above all, Vicki loved dogs. She raised several mastiffs—Sheba, George, and Gracie—and several Greater Swiss Mountain Dogs or “Swissy’s”—Jesse and Shepherd.

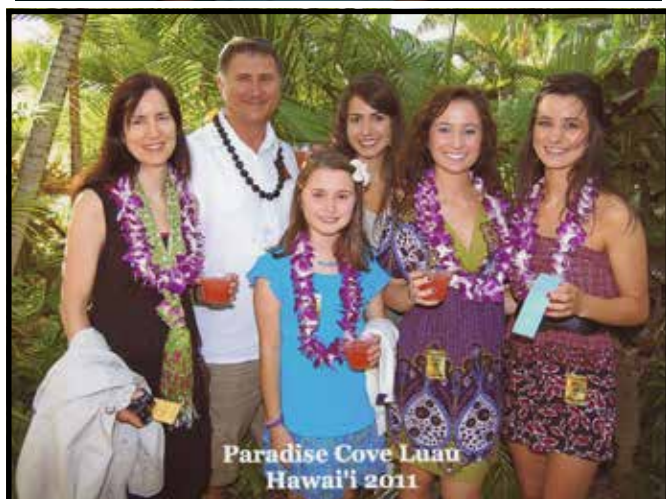

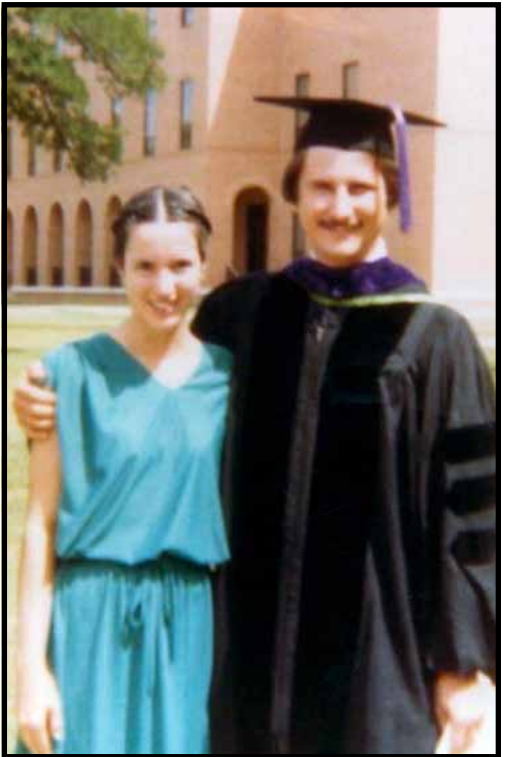

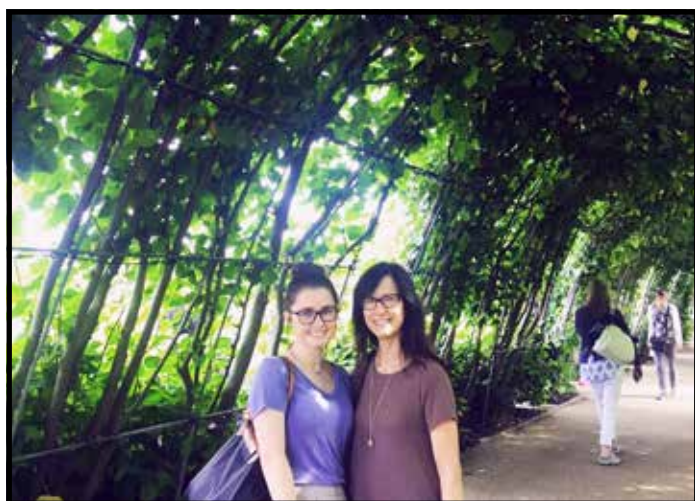
