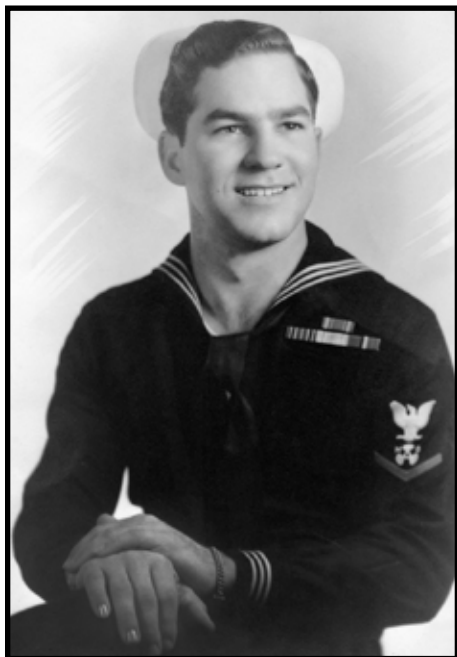

Pierre Lawrence Trahan, 90, of China, died Thursday, August 31, 2017, at Harbor Hospice, Beaumont. He was born on September 16, 1926, to Delia Thibodeaux Trahan and Nelton Trahan, in Morse, Louisiana, and was a veteran of the United States Navy having served in World War II. He came to Texas at three months old.

Mr. Trahan was an operator in the Lube Plant at Beaumont's Mobil Oil refinery for many years, retiring in 1982 as a unit supervisor. He truly enjoyed gardening, fishing, shrimping and getting together with family and friends to make smoked sausage, chicken and ribs. He also loved sharing the fruits of his labor with family, as well as neighbors and friends.

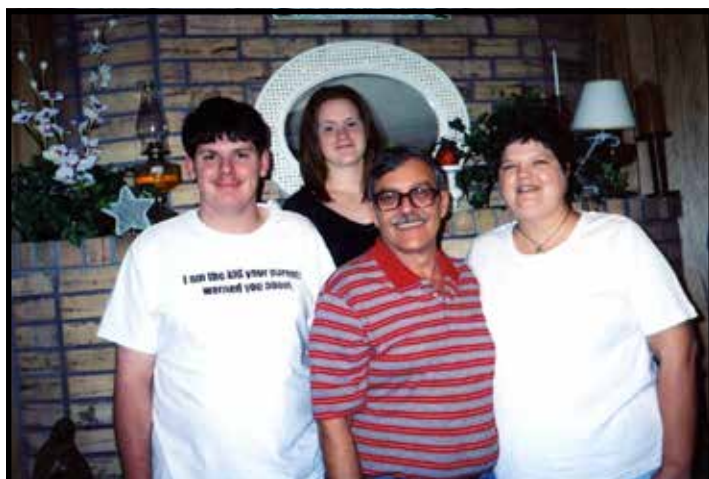
He is preceded in death by his grandson, Earl Lawrence Trahan.
