Sandra and Larry were married for 51 beautiful and adventurous years. They loved living life together and were rarely apart. They are once again together and dancing on the streets of gold.



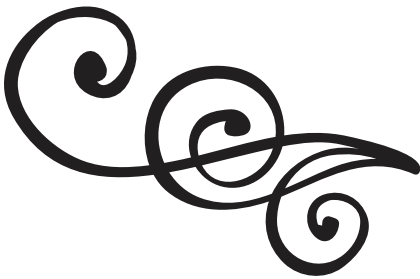




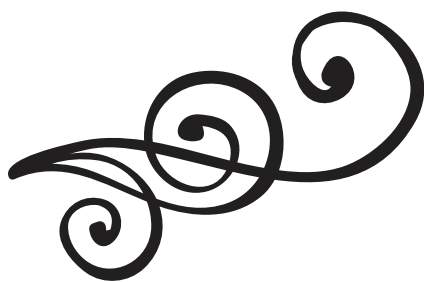




























### Psalm 23
