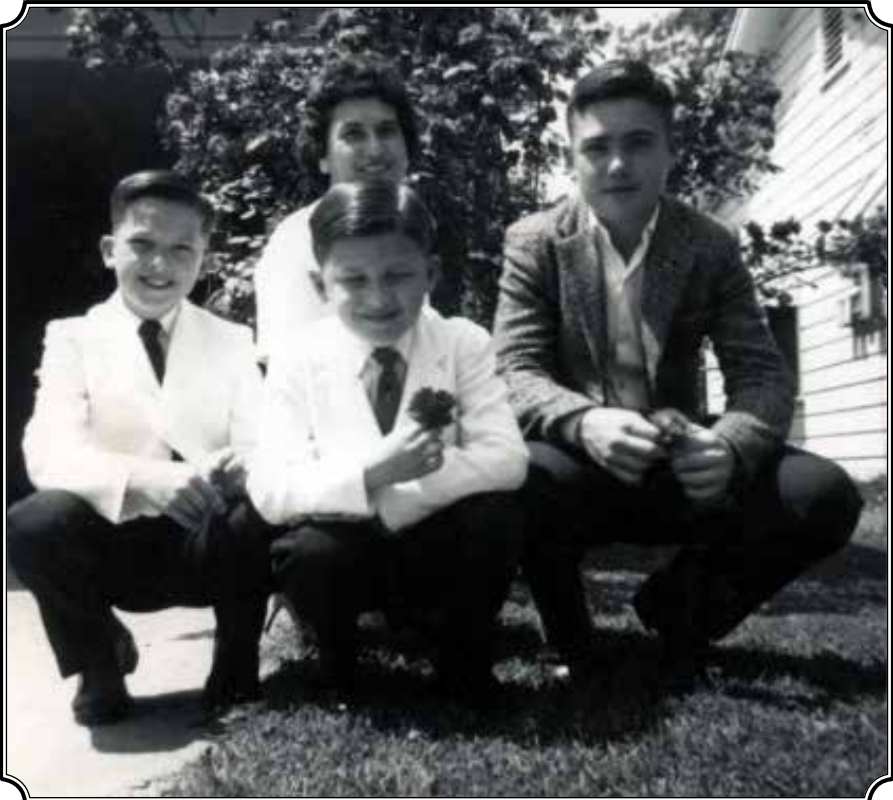
She was a member of North End Baptist Church since the early 1950’s.
