Elementary, Odem Middle School and West Brook High School. He attended Texas A&M and graduated from Lamar University.

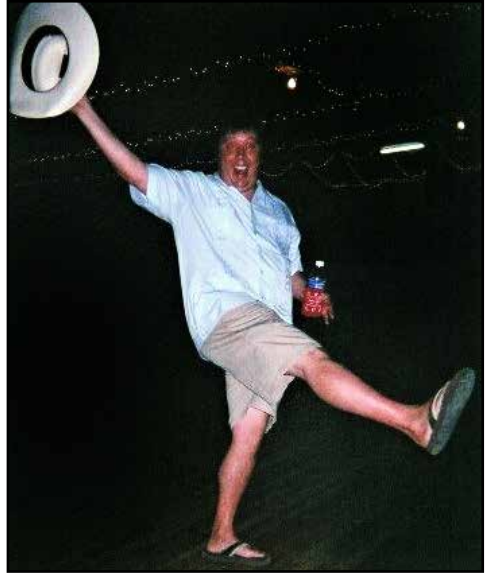

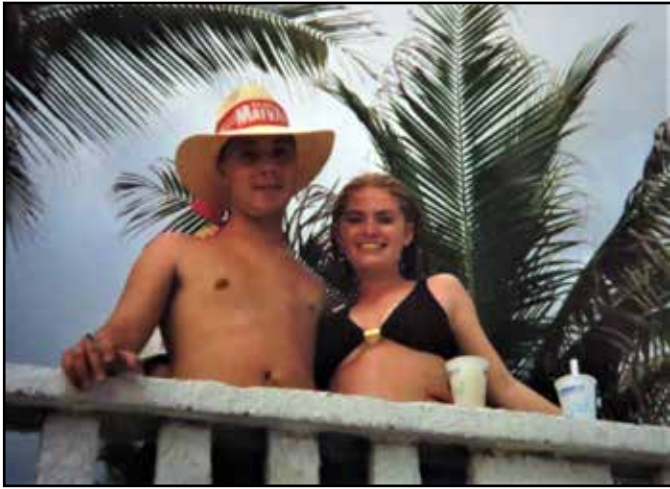
