Survivors include her four children: Janice Marrou, of Beaumont; Thomas Marrou,

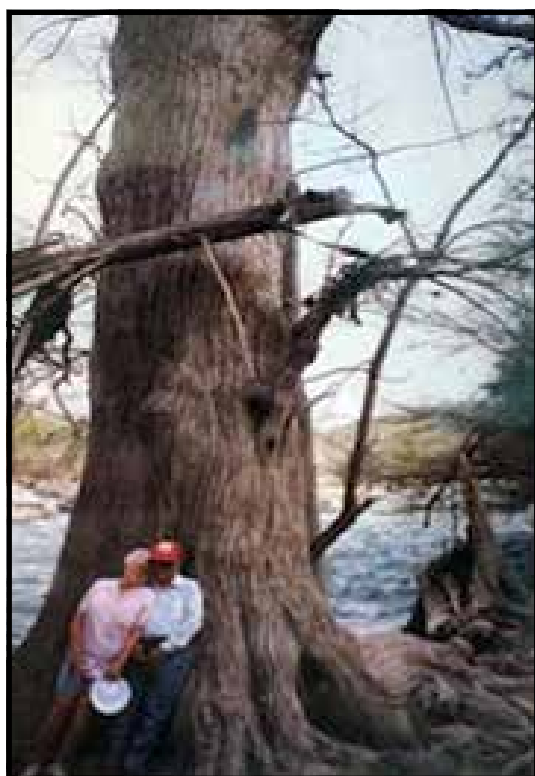

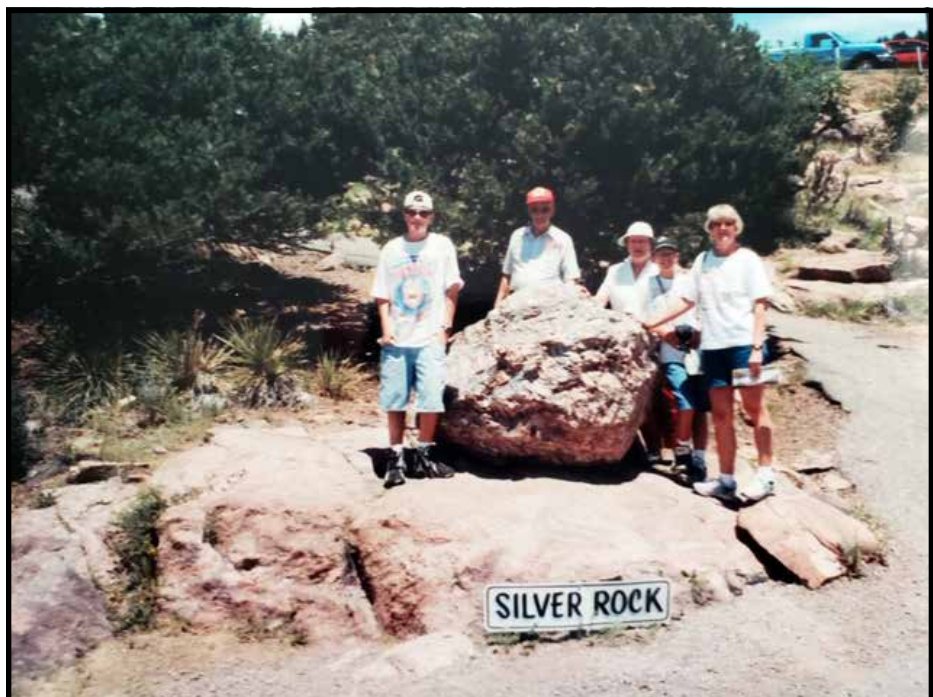
