great cowboy, but a better horseman born a century too late.


Taylor's passion was to concoct the most elaborate "pranks" imaginable. No matter how long it took, he always managed to pull it off.





Taylor is preceded in death by his parents; brother, Kyle; and sister, Jo Rella Meaux.

















What It Takes To Be A Cowboy

He meets along life's way.





He tips his hat or gives a nod

To each gentleman he greets.





He's firm in his convictions

He never makes a show.


To think of life without him
