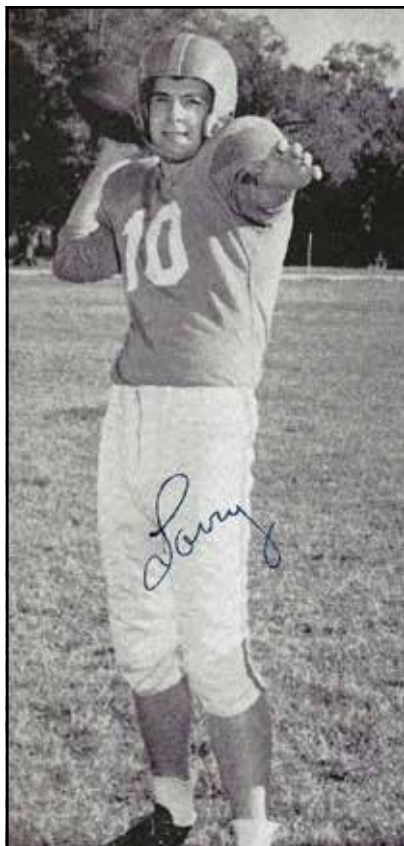
He went to work at Beaumont Machine Shop. Larry left there

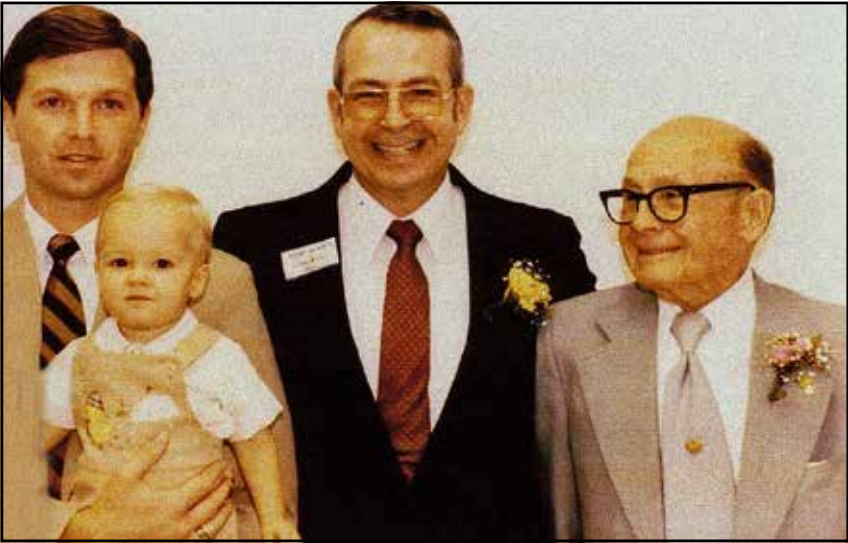
and went into business with his father at Porter’s Carpet and became owner after his parents retired. He retired in 2020 and turned the business over to his daughter and grandson.

In addition to his parents, he is preceded in death by his two sisters, Patsy Porter and Barbara Porter Scott.





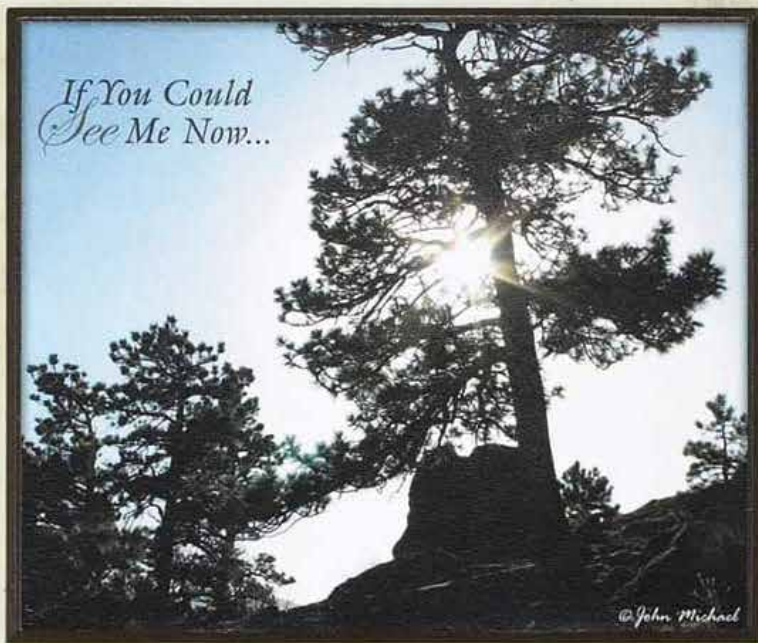












*If you could see me now, you wouldn't shed a tear.
