She is preceded in death by her late husband, James Jenkins and her parents.

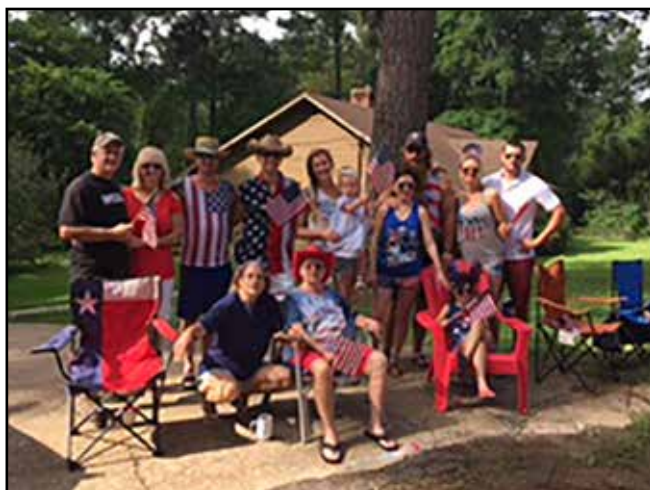
