Kathy Jo Fontenot Simpson, 65, of Silsbee, was born on January 10, 1956, to Aubrey James Fontenot and Dorothy Fay Biddle Fontenot. Kathy was her mother's pride and joy and was a devoted and caring daughter throughout her life. Kathy took her heavenly flight home on Wednesday, September 29, 2021. We take comfort in knowing that although she is absent from her body, she is now present with the Lord, our Savior. One of the final things Kathy said to several of us before she was

hospitalized was, "Jesus has always been with me, and He'll be with me through this, too". Kathy knew where her help came from, and she spoke of her faith with assurance.

Kathy served as the Court Clerk for Justice of the Peace Como for over twelve and a half years. Upon his retirement, she ran and was successfully elected as Justice of the Peace for Precinct 2 in 1993. She took office in January of 1994 and served until her retirement in 2014. During her years as JP, she valued the relationships she developed with the residents of the county, friends at the courthouse, fellow judges and their clerks, deputies, and especially with her close friend and court clerk, Carolyn. We could always be certain that around Thanksgiving time, the phone calls would begin as she started to invite, rather forcefully, everyone to the Thanksgiving Feast at the JP office.

Although she loved her job, her true joy came from her family. She always regretted having to work so many hours and missing so many things when Heath was growing up, so she made it her mission to never miss a game, ceremony, school program, Grandparents' Day lunch, or any other special days in Cole or Kade's lives. She was the true definition of a loving and devoted grandmother, and her absence will forever be felt.

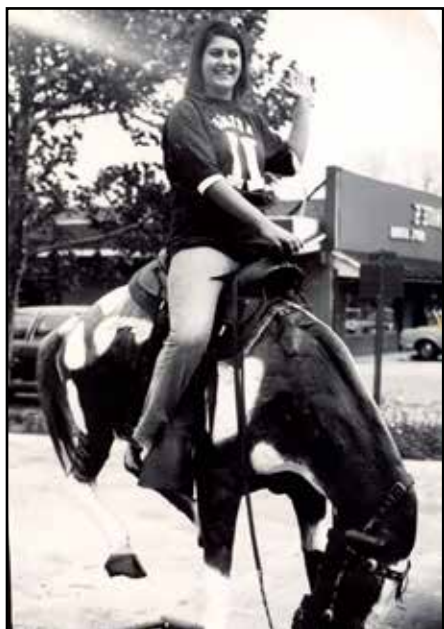

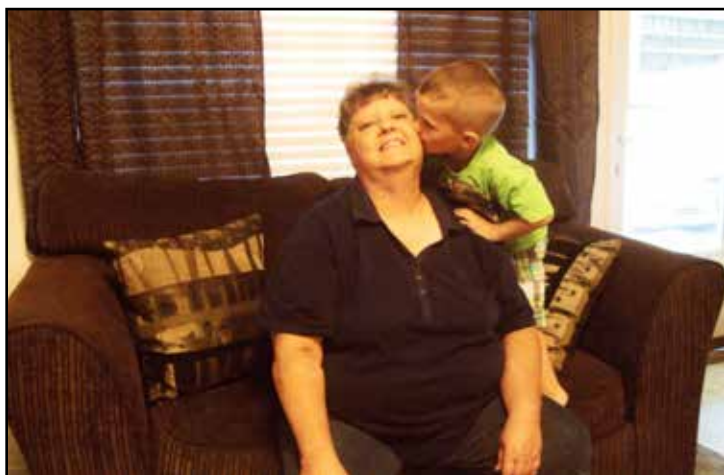
