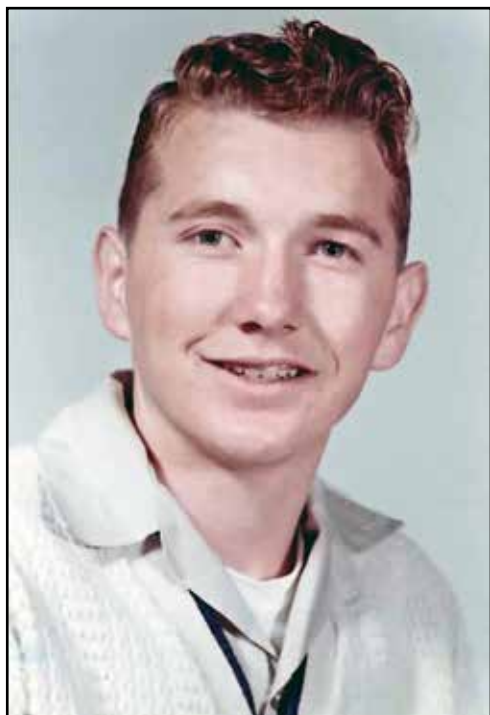

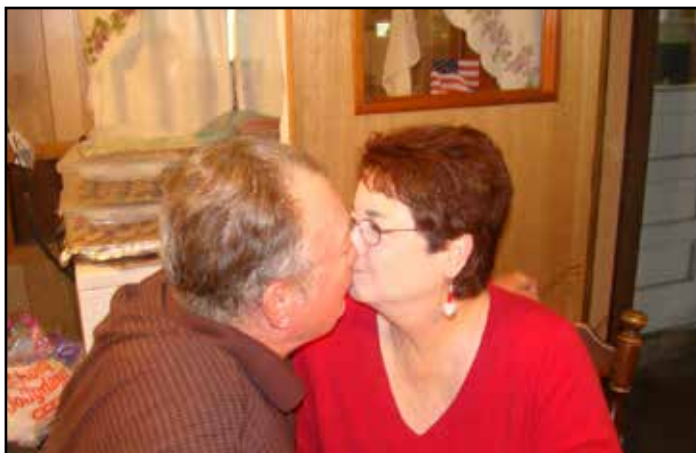














Revelation 21:1-7
