Robert E. Lynch gained his wings, Thursday, May 19, 2022, at MD Anderson Cancer Center, with his wife by his side.

He attended Thomas Jefferson High School, and married Susan, his high school sweetheart, in 1967. They had two daughters and two granddaughters. He loved when his daughters and granddaughters asked him for help. When his granddaughters spent the night, they would wake up to a clean car, with cash on the seat.


He is preceded in death by his parents; daughter, Jennifer “René” Lynch; and brother, Howard Lynch.

He had a huge collection of hats and caps, and always wore a hat. He had friends everywhere. He never met a stranger. No matter how far away from home he was, he always ran into a friend.


