Beverly Rose Duplant, 68, of Port Neches, Texas, went home to Heaven on Sunday, July 10, 2022, after extensive illness.

She is in heavenly reunion with her mother and father, Rose Mary Hodges and Francis John Duplant; brother, Lloyd Allen Duplant; and two nephews.

She is survived by her sister, Jo Ann Larson; children, Michael Ray Palmer and Tara Denise Pulliam-Alvarez; grandchildren, Christopher Byron Douglas; D'Lorah Zenna-Raye Smith; Charleston Kaid Smith; and Simona Rose Alvarez; great-granddaughter, Luna Renae Nadeau; a niece and two nephews; and the love of her life, Woodrow Pritchard.



Beverly was a native of Port Arthur, Texas, as was her father, Francis John Duplant. Her mother, Rose Mary, was one of thirteen Hodges children raised in the mountains of Shasta, California. Rose Mary worked at the Treasure Island Naval Station where Frank repaired submarine batteries during WWII. They were married fifty-eight years. Beverly was born on September 27, 1953, the youngest of their three children. Lloyd, the oldest, preceded her in death in 2021. She is survived by her sister, Jo Ann Larson.





Beverly began elementary academics at Saint James' Catholic School, later attended Edison Middle School, & graduated from Thomas Jefferson High School in 1972. She was a honor roll student, homeroom secretary, member of the Future Business Leaders of America club, and nurse's aide at Saint Mary's Hospital.









Beverly was Goddaughter to Charlene Duplant, wife of Uncle George, and the late Marcine Boudreaux, husband of Aunt Irene. Beverly received her last rites from Father Coon of Saint Peter's Catholic Church in Groves, moments before her heavenly departure on July 10, 2022.







Woody Pritchard was Beverly's first boyfriend. They met at the baseball field in Port Arthur when she was in the eighth grade, and he was in the tenth. Woody rescued her hairbrush from another boy who thought to tease her with a game of keep away; he was her hero from the start. The next fifty years would lead them in different directions, but fate drew them together again. Woody treated her like a queen, caring for her with the deepest love and tenderness before and after illness took hold. She loved him dearly, as we all do now. We never saw her so happy. We are eternally grateful to Woody for keeping her smiling, even in her pain.



Zenna made Beverly a great-grandmother with the birth of Luna on December 15, 2021. She was spoiling Luna, even before she was born. Beverly enjoyed week-long visits with Luna and her girls in February and in May. This week was expected to be a third; however, the good Lord had other plans. A recent bout with pneumonia proved more than she could bare. Her health took a drastic turn on Sunday, July 10th, the morning after our arrival. 
