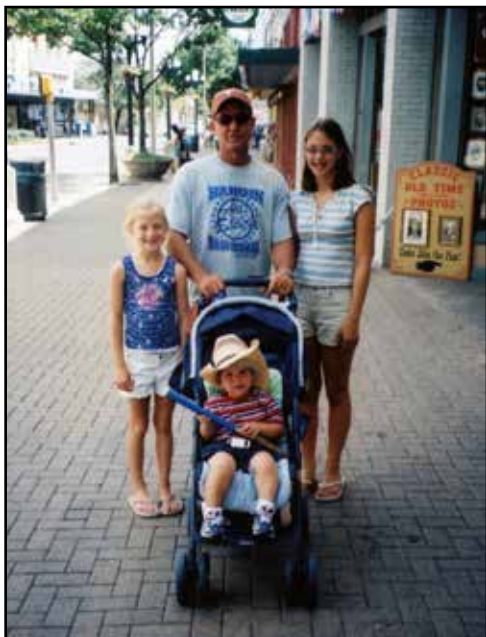

He was preceded in death by Pawpaw James Shirley; W.J. Zickefoose; and uncle, Kenneth Shirley.









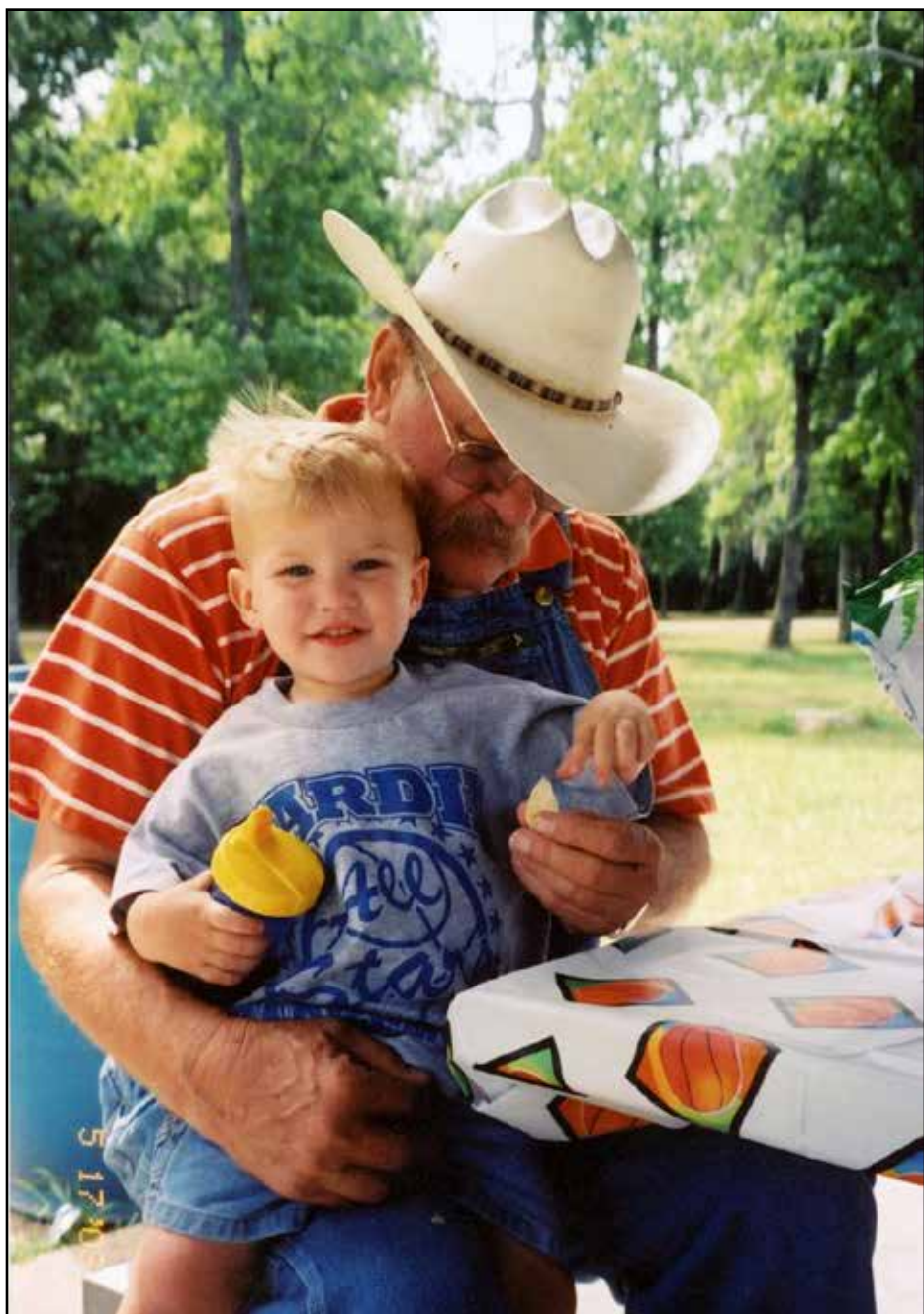



