

Tracy was a skilled carpenter and served as the contractor for the rebuilding of his entire home after the Hurricane Harvey flood. He was a talented




He is survived by his wife of forty years, Cheryl Jardell O'Quinn and numerous nieces and nephews.




He will be remembered as a loving husband, father, and friend.

The family would like to thank all the medical doctors and staff that attended to him in his final years, with a special thanks to Acadian Ambulance.






















































Firefighter's Prayer
