Shawn quite literally danced through life. If there was a dance floor, he would be in the center of it. In fact, there didn't even have to be a dance floor for him to break out his moves.

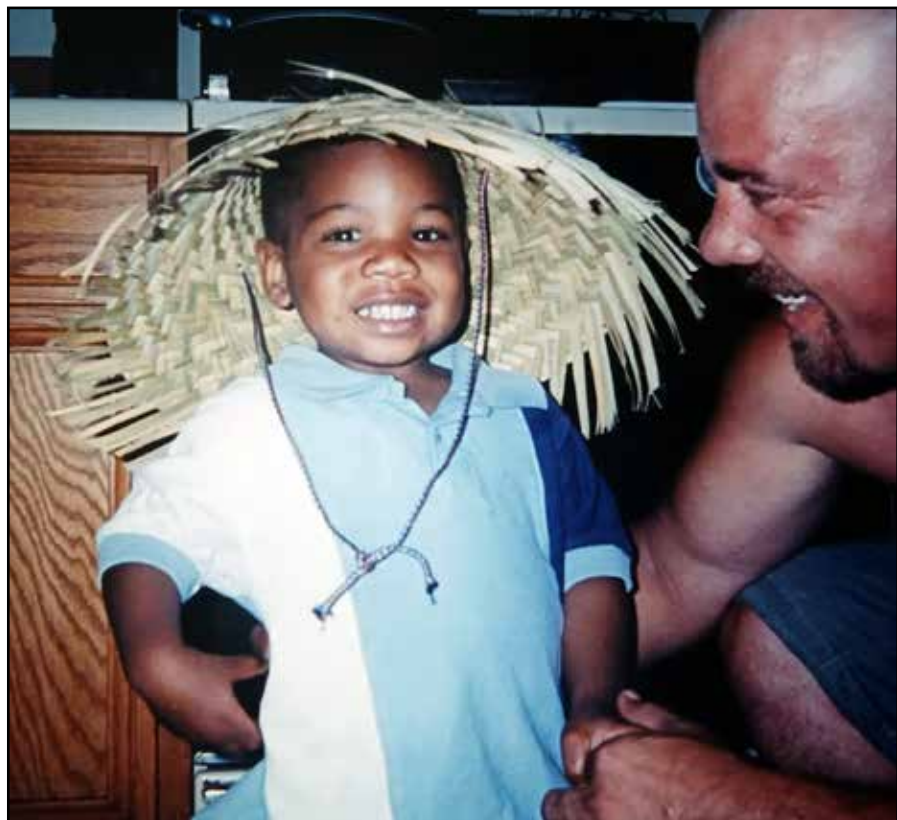
