After graduating high school, Donnie, as he liked to be called, met his sweetheart, Virginia, after admiring her beautiful green dress and offering her a ride home from work one day. This car ride led to four daughters, a successful business, and a lifetime of memories. Shortly after marrying Virginia, Donnie joined the Army. He was stationed in Washington for a

short time but ultimately ended back up in China on that same dairy he grew up on.

















