



In the course of Keith's career with Allseas he led the team that was the first to lay a pipeline north of the Artic Circle and was on the teams that were the first to lay pipe over a mile deep on the ocean floor, as well as being the first to use dynamic positioning on a pipelay vessel for the purpose of laying pipe.

Keith traveled and worked all over the world and at the time of his passing he had worked on every inhabited continent on the planet as well as having worked on every ocean. He is deeply missed by his offshore family. Keith was a great mentor, and leader, to many in his industry and will be remembered as much for achievements as he will be for his good nature, integrity, and dedication that he always traveled with.

Keith had an encyclopedic knowledge, quick wit, sharp tongue, with a loving heart, generous and giving spirit, to go along with a penchant for mischief that spared no one, and he will be missed by everyone that knew and loved him.


